- Parent/Teacher conferences held on November 2nd were very well attended. We received a lot of great feedback from families and our teachers worked diligently to plan for these important meetings and to ensure they met with every guardian.
- LES Committee Work – Each team shared their focus and progress to the entire staff at our recent November 6th Professional Learning Day. Every certified staff member at LES serves on one of the following committees.
 - ✓ PBIS Team – This team under the leadership of Mr. Chenot and Mrs. Colliver continues to work to improve and enhance our new PBIS structure at LES.
 - ✓ Curriculum Team – The curriculum team is working with Mr. Wolf to update/revise our current writing policy/plan.
 - ✓ Instructional Strategies Team – Mrs. Dragan continues to work with this team on the development of our CSIP and have completed required diagnostic items to submit to the state.
