- I. Call to order at 3:40PM and roll call of members.
 - a. Members Present: Kristie Stanfield, Joe Moneymaker, Crystal Jennings, Kim Hays
 - b. Members Absent: Alicia Paris, Kathren Hayes, Courtney Vasquez
- II. Opening Business
 - a. Agenda Approval- **Motion made by Kristie Stanfield and Second by Joe Moneymaker; Approved**
 - b. Approval of minutes from SBDM meeting on August 16, 22, September 6, 13, 20, and October 4, 2017- **Motion made by Kim Hays and Second by Kristie Stanfield; Approved by consensus**
 - c. Good News
10 students recognized at board meeting, Staff live red award to Mrs. Lummus, A.R. tests for students are looking good in 2nd and 3rd grade, new schedule is going well and we have noticed some improvement on the progress monitoring.
How are the new books working? Great and it has a lot of resources. Mr. Moneymaker and Mrs. Goss received a grant for STEM instruction; loving the simple solutions pilot program.

 - b. ESS: \$11,390.02

- i. All ESS funds are used for instructional assistant to provide tutoring for students
- c. PL : \$0 (All funds have been spent for MAF required trainings – 3 teachers)
- d. 2016 Vulcan donation: \$0 (used to pay part of bill for 3rd grade reading textbooks)
- e. 2017 Vulcan donation: \$1,152.62 (earmarked to pay for the reading training in May)
- f. PTO donation (playground): \$97.73
- g. Westat Healthy School Program: \$713.00
- h. Title I funds (additional): \$4597.61 – Consider how to utilize these funds

Discussion was held on possible usage of the funds. Discussion on the usage of consumable products and the desire to purchase simple solutions. Idea to increase the amount of math intervention materials that could be available to staff for planning, instruction, and interventions. Mr. Moneymaker discussed a desire to have classroom set of books- this would be Title I funds and the reminder was given that these funds are designed for struggling students.

Motion made by Joe Moneymaker to table the discussion, second by Kristie Stanfield; information will be gathered before the next meeting and discussion will resume;

- a. Kindergarten: $26 + 25 = 51$ total **(3 over cap)**
- b. 1st grade: $24 + 23 = 47$ total
- c. 1st/2nd Split: 6 first graders + 11 second graders = 17 total
- d. 2nd grade: $26 + 26 = 52$ total **(4 over cap)**
- e. 2nd/3rd grade: 11 second graders + 8 third graders = 19 total
- f. 3rd grade: $25 + 26 = 51$ total **(3 over cap)**
- g. 4th grade: $25 + 27 = 52$ total
- h. 4th/5th grade: 8 fourth graders + 9 fifth graders = 17 total
- i. 5th grade: $27 + 27 = 54$ total
- j. Primary = 237 total
- k. Intermediate = 123 total
- l. Total students K-5 = 360

Discussion on numbers and capacity in the classrooms and if it is best to redistribute the students to better serve the students.

Suggestion by Kristie Stanfield to move 3 students from the 2nd grade classes to the 1st/2nd split and 1 to the 2nd/3rd split. This will bring the 2nd grade classes to cap and the 2 split classes to 20 each.

Suggestion by Joe Moneymaker Move 4 2nd graders to the 1st/2nd split and 3 3rd grade student to the 2nd/3rd split

Move 2 from 2nd to the 1st second split and 1 from 3rd grade to the 2nd/3rd split

Motion made by Joe Moneymaker and second by Kristie Stanfield to move 4 2nd graders to the 1st/2nd split and 3 3rd graders to the 2nd/3rd split bringing numbers to:

- 1st/2nd Split: 6 first graders + 15 second graders = 21 total
- 2nd grade: $24 + 24 = 48$ total **(@ cap)**
- 2nd/3rd grade: 11 second graders + 11 third graders = 22 total
- 3rd grade: $24 + 24 = 48$ total **(@ cap)**
