John Hardin High School is one of four high schools serving the students of Elizabethtown and Hardin County and is located between the towns of Radcliff and Elizabethtown, Kentucky. With a diverse population of about 900 students, our students come from both rural and urban backgrounds. There are 54% of our students receiving free or reduced meals and 14% of our students have a disability. The military greatly influences our student population, as many families we serve are active or retired military or are support personnel at the military installation on Fort Knox. This presents the challenges associated with transient populations. We currently have a 45% percent minority population made up of African Americans (23.5%), Hispanic (9.3%), Asian (2.5%), Pacific Islander (1%) and Two or more Races (8%). The John Hardin faculty is comprised of 58 certified teachers, 4 administrators and 2 counselors.

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students place in the top 20% in the world at a DECA conference as well as several top finishes in BETA.
