Part Time Care-One half hour up to three hours of care

- Note-Tuition slots in the traditional ½ day NAEYC classroom (blended Preschool/Head Start may still be available per board policy on tuition slots at \$100 per month for 128 instructional days per school year (4 day a week, 3.5 hour program)
- Tuition parents needing full day care could enroll tuition children in childcare classroom at rates listed above.
- Daycare employees/workers may receive a 50% discount on tuition rates.

- Up to 100% of Poverty indicates that these children are income eligible for both Head Start & KERA-at-Risk.
- Up to 130% of Poverty indicates that these children are income eligible for Head Start / Early Head Start and KERA-at-Risk 4 year olds. **Exception:** HS/EHS Children who are 100% of Poverty and below must be served first. Also, the total enrollment for 130% of poverty for Head Start / Early Head Start must not exceed 35% of the total funded enrollment.
- Up to 160% of Poverty indicates that these children are income eligible for KERA-at-Risk, but over-income for Head Start / Early Head Start.
- Up to 185% of Poverty and over indicates that these children are over-income for Head Start / Early Head Start and KERA-at-Risk.
- No Income requirements for KERA Disability.
