Needs Assessment Data Summary

66% of parents surveyed responded they believe their student was in need of mental/behavioral health counseling. Of the same parents 92% said their child struggles with an issue related to mental/behavioral health. The student survey was even more telling. 44% of students believed they were in need of counseling, up from 17% in the previous needs assesment. This shows that mental/behavioral health is moving from having negative stigma, to a more positive one!

58.7% of students who responded to the YSC survey mentioned that they believe drugs are one of the biggest things teens need help with as well as one of their biggest concerns for our community. 54% of students surveyed have used alcohol or drugs within the past 6 months. 42% of students responded they believe it is only somewhat wrong or not wrong at all for students their age to drink alcohol and 58% of the students responded said it was only somewhat wrong or not wrong at all to smoke marijuana.
