# CALL TO ORDER

# GENERAL DISCUSSION

### Bullitt Young Talent Enrichment (BYTE) Program

In November 2017, the Board approved the Revenue in Lieu of Taxes Agreement with Beam-Suntory and the establishment and maintenance of an early education program to serve high-risk, high potential students with a portion of the provided funding. The intent of this program is to prepare such students for formal evaluation and acceptance into the district Gifted and Talented program along with providing opportunities to identify and develop individual talents of young students. This commitment stemmed from the fact that BCPS has adopted progressive protocols to identify young children as high potential, but had no specific interventions for these students with risk factors (poverty, minority status, or other special circumstances) that prevent them from achieving to their potential. There is a significant amount of research that indicates that many high potential learners never develop to their full potential due to socio-economic or environmental conditions that limit the experiential-conceptual backgrounds necessary for making important intellectual connections and may impede exposure to critical early support in the form of parental and community recognition and nurturing of their potential. Presented is a plan that will guide the beginnings of the Bullitt Young Talent Enrichment (BYTE) program. As with any new program, it is expected to evolve through and beyond the initial implementation year. To summarize BYTE, the district intends to support identified students through the second half of their kindergarten year and during a summer session. When they enter first grade, transportation will be provided to the BYTE program at Maryville Elementary as a schoolwithin-a-school with specialized teachers, a tailored talent development program, and counseling services for students and their families or caregivers.

Envision Learning Partners Contract

The proposed contract with Envision Learning Partners from Oakland, California is for professional development services for the remainder of the 2017-2018 school year. Envision Learning Partners provides consulting for college and career readiness assessment systems, K-12 by assisting districts and schools with the creation of graduate profiles aligned to competency-based assessments. A district team representing a variety of roles within the district will participate in the training and assist with leading the work at the school and/or district level. Goals for this training will focus on creating a prototype of a graduate profile of identified competencies and understanding the concept of competency-based assessments and their alignment for all BCPS students to be "life-ready." In addition, this work complements current work of creating thinking-focused classrooms and increasing student ownership of learning and doing. Due to the rise of personalized learning, the assessment movement towards competencies and grant funding opportunities offered through the KDE on competency-based systems, it is essential to provide training to gain a thorough understanding of this work and assistance for implementation, as appropriate. The total cost of all Envision Learning Partners services is \$4,000. All training will be in person and/or virtually. Funding is available in the Student Learning Department budget. This contract was reviewed by Eric Farris.
