- School Safety As we are waiting for the results of the audit from the Kentucky Center for School Safety we are beginning to look at our School safety plans. Through the TSA study and recent conferences our biggest item to address will be communication. In the wake of recent events at schools across the country, all schools need to look at their plans for communication both during and after a tragic event.
- School calendar Along with the second reading of the 18-19 Calendar I have presented the revised 17-18 Calendar for your approval. Currently we have cancelled 2 days due to weather (Jan. 8 and Feb. 7) We were able to build one makeup day into the calendar; however, we will have to make the other day up. The student Makeup day will extend the instructional days to June 1. Staff will have to make up both missed days. That is why a PD day was added on June 4th. The closing day for Staff will now be on June 5th. These makeup days should have no effect on Graduation.
- Enrollment at Schools Now a month and a half into returning enrollment back to the schools I am happy to report the process seems to be working well. Other than a few problems as expected the process is working. I have had to reinforce the checking of residency documents and the importance of a home visit when in doubt.
