Stacy,

If you have additional questions, don't hesitate to let us know. Ryan and I can come to your school and present everything to both students and staff.

All of Ryan's information is correct. Here are the requirements listed in the brochure. It sometimes helps to think of our DC program as having 3 levels (see below). So, a senior who qualifies for 2 free classes per semester could take 2 classes in the Fall and Spring semesters. A junior who qualifies for 1 free class could take one class each Fall/Spring of both his or her Jr/Sr year. Of course, a student could improve his or ACT and move up from 1 class to two classes.

- 1. Students with a 3.0 GPA and min. ACT of 18 Eng, 20 Reading and 20 Composite qualify for the Dual Credit tuition (Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 is \$53 per credit hour-\$159 for a 3 credit-hour course). In the past, schools have used funds from their state/KHEAA dual credit funds to pay or students pick up the costs.
- 2. EKU Now! Dual Credit Scholarship One (1) Dual Credit class free per semester (Fall/Spring)

You must have a 3.0 high school GPA or higher.

You must have minimum ACT scores of 18 in English, 19 in Math, 20 in Reading and a 21 Composite.

3. Whitlock Scholar Candidate - Two (2) Dual Credit classes free per semester (Fall/Spring)

A minimum un-weighted 3.5 high school GPA.

Minimum ACT scores of 18 in Eng, 19 in Math, 20 in Reading and a 23 Comp.

For now, we plan to offer the classes below in an Online/Web-Blended format each Fall/Spring Semester. So, your qualified students could take up to 1 or 2 of them during the Fall/Spring semesters.

We plan to re-visit the classes we offer each year to make certain they fit within our budget and program goals. So, the above classes are what we're planning for the 2018/19 school year, unless we get drastic budget news from Frankfort.
