Students will experience history with hands-on activities and interact with the staff that will be portraying characters from the past. The students will discover what life was like to live an 1836 pioneer village and what it was like to be a member of the Confederate army. Throughout the day, students will get to visit each of the five historical eras and experience life through trade, war, school, and day to day jobs as a member of each era.

When students return back to school, they will analyze the similarities and differences between the five eras.

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
