

We build our local workforce in two ways: first from within by providing training opportunities for current employees and second, by partnering with our local schools and the Nelson County Area Technology Center by training high school students to become the future employees of our members.

Our company members have partnered with the Nelson County School system and the Bardstown City Schools by participating in mock interview days and becoming members of the Area Technology Center program advisory committees. Our company members have provided coop and intern opportunities for many years. Our sincere interest in bring the proper training for high school students as perspective employees is proven by our active participation.

Our members have stated many times that their primary needs for new employees are in the areas of machine tool, industrial maintenance, welding and various phases of the automotive industry. I personally, participated in the program committee for the Elizabethtown Community and Technical College Springfield Campus. Our committee voiced our preference for Industrial Maintenance and tool and die making. The ECTC administrators along with our local political leaders listened to our committee and those two areas became the primary programs for the ECTC Springfield campus.

Our community and technical college system has fostered the concept of duel credit for students in both academic and technical programs. Kentucky is one of only two states were instructors at the secondary level are required to hold their industry credentials that means that in order to be a welding instructor, for example, one must poses the national welding certification. The same goes for an automotive instructor and so on. Our secondary instructors whose programs qualify for duel credit are all certified to be instructors at the postsecondary level as well.

One of our company members (Flowers Baking Company) originally required all new hires to hold a two years associate degree from the community and technical college system. The type of program that Nelson County is working to implement would eventually lead many companies to view new employees in that light. Duel credit would drastically speed up that kind of process. It would also give students an opportunity to work and go to school at the same time, once they have graduated high school with the advancement of duel credit while in high school.

Our company members often participate in job fairs and post job opportunities regularly around the community in various places. I can speak from our members past history and state that they have demonstrated a willingness to participate in mock interviews and program steering committees. By working with our Area Technology Center and high schools, our companies will be providing feedback surrounding career pathways, alignment with manufacturing opportunities.

NELCO Training, Inc. members have worked closely with the staff from the Nelson County Economic Development Agency to further industry growing, job opportunities and guidance to the schools to bring secondary students into the career paths that will lead to long careers in various manufacturing fields.
