Students will look inside an actual horse training center, and not only come away realizing the rich traditions associated with the Derby, but also the importance that horses have to our state. Over 150,000 jobs in Kentucky are in an equine-related

field. In 2011 the total of all sales and income from equine operations was almost \$1.1 billion. There are 245,000 horses residing in Kentucky. The total estimated value of these horses is \$6.3 billion. Seven colleges and universities in Kentucky offer four year degrees programs in equine fields. Horses in Kentucky are simply more than a beautiful yard ornament or fun pet.
