- School Table Top Safety Exercise Each of our schools will be doing a tabletop exercise in May to review their School Safety plans in a scenario based situation. The Transportation Safety Administration through Homeland Security will be hosting these exercises for us. After the exercise there will be time to debrief and reflect on what changes need to be made on next year's plan. The High School session will be held on May 9th. The Intermediate School session will be held on May 10th, and the Primary School Session will be held on May 9th. A follow up session will be held with all schools on May 17th to discuss changes to next year's safety Plans.
- Student Code of Conduct held a meeting with the Codebook committee on April 19th to discuss changes in the Student code of conduct for next year. Other than revisions to pages and forms one of the major changes that was decided is to separate the forms from the code book. The tearing out of pages has always been problematic and leaves the remaining book a mess. Also if a form is changed last minute it is difficult to control inaccurate forms that have already been distributed. While the code book will still contain policies and information referencing forms, each school will assemble a packet of forms with only the forms that pertain to their grade level. It was also decided to eliminate the household information form that is lengthy and confusing with individualized forms printed from Infinite campus that would allow parents to only correct the inaccurate or outdated information.
- Move up Day I have meet with all school counselors regarding move up day on May 29th. There will be no significant changes from Move up day last year. We will be giving T-Shirts to the grades changing buildings and they will get to eat lunch in the building they are moving up too.
