How is it being used?

The Snapshot Observation Tool is used to collect data, which guides the Child Development & Education unit's placement of classrooms on the data wall. The placement within levels on the data wall determines **Practice Based Coaching**, which is a cyclical process for supporting teachers' use of effective teaching practices that

leads to positive outcomes for children.




The 3 Components of Practice Based Coaching are:

- 1: Shared Goals and Action Planning.
- 2: Engaging in Focused Observation.
- 3: Reflection and feedback about teaching practices.

Snapshot Rubric Scoring

Three tiers will result from the Snapshot data collection. Each indicator met on the Snapshot is valued at one point. The sum of the indicators met determines the classrooms tier placement.



Tiered Levels of Support

The level of support given is determined by tier placement. Coaching support includes examples of the following, but are not limited to:

Level 1: Email communication, phone calls, shared resources such as: journal articles, videos, peer examples, and purchasing approval and/or assistance

Level 2: Biweekly visit to classroom, snapshots, co-teaching/modeling lessons, email communication, phone calls, shared resources such as: journal articles, videos, peer examples, and purchasing approval and/or assistance

<u>Level 3:</u> Snapshot Data-based Feedback Report, implementation of Practice Based Coaching in the classroom with on site coach, Child Development & Education Unit assistance, eWalk observations, co-teaching/modeling lessons, specific embedded professional development,

Level A: Administrative Review- This level of support would suggest that the classroom is beyond the level of traditional coaching. Supervisory guidance is recommended.
