Proposed changes

K-12 Changes

- Removed language about writing portfolios (due to state regulation change) and added language about tracking evidence of student learning to each level procedure section. (E: pg. 8; M: pg. 16; H: pg. 7)
- Updated the grade appeals ending the process with the principal and adding language about ELs (E: pg. 18, M: pg 16; H: pg15)

High School Specific Changes

- Add language about the new Civics Test graduation requirement (pg. 9)
 - In 2017, the Kentucky General Assembly passed Senate Bill 159 (2017). The law reads that beginning in July 2018, a student must pass a civics test composed of 100 questions to graduate from a public high school with a regular diploma. Students must score 60% or higher and may retake the exam as often as necessary to pass the test.

- Add/Clarify information in the Grading and Transcripts section (pg. 12)
 - Retaking courses not failed/failed & impact on transcript
 - Circumstances when a transcript can be changed
 - Section on dual credit courses and grade reporting expectations (taught by HS faculty)
 - Amend grade concern language; school has final say
- Updated language about EOC use in grading (pg. 14)
