MUNICIPAL ORDER 12-2018

A MUNICIPAL ORDER AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN APPLICATION FOR A COMPETITIVE **GRANT** FY2018 **THROUGH** THE SERVICE THE KENTUCKY 911 BOARDS IN **APPROXIMATE AMOUNT** OF \$15,876.50, THE PROCEEDS OF WHICH WILL BE UTILIZED BY THE CITY OF OWENSBORO TO PURCHASE 911 CONSOLE FURNITURE FOR THE OWENSBORO-DAVIESS COUNTY **CENTRALIZED 911 COMMUNICATIONS CENTER: A FIVE** PERCENT (5%) MATCH BEING REQUIRED BY THE CITY.

WHEREAS, the Owensboro-Daviess County Centralized 911 Communications seeks to file an application for a FY2018 Competitive Grant through the Kentucky 911 Service Boards in the approximate amount of \$15,876.50, the proceeds of which the City of Owensboro will purchase 911 console furniture to retrofit an existing space to be conducive to function as a 911 call-taking/dispatching position; and

WHEREAS, the console furniture has been ergonomically designed to more efficiently use the space and effectively operate a 911 call taking position; and

WHEREAS, the grant application shall include the cost of freight and installation; and

WHEREAS, a five percent (5%) match is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY OF OWENSBORO, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to execute a grant application to be filed with the 911 Emergency Service Boards for the FY2018 State 911 Emergency Service Board Program for grant funds in the amount of

approximately \$15,876.50 to purchase 911 console furniture to retrofit an existing space to be conducive to function as a 911 call-taking/dispatching position, for which a five percent (5%) match shall be required from the City.

Section 2. That the Mayor, City Manager and appropriate staff members are hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all other agreements, instruments or documents necessary and appropriate to effectuate and implement any grants awarded to the City.
