MUNICIPAL ORDER 13-2018

A MUNICIPAL ORDER AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN APPLICATION FOR A COMPETITIVE FY2018 **GRANT THROUGH** THE SERVICE **BOARDS** THE KENTUCKY 911 IN APPROXIMATE **AMOUNT** OF \$29,337.00, THE PROCEEDS OF WHICH WILL BE UTILIZED BY THE CITY OF OWENSBORO TO PURCHASE A MOTOROLA RADIO CALL DISPATCH SOFTWARE LICENSE FOR THE OWENSBORO-DAVIESS COUNTY CENTRALIZED 911 COMMUNICATIONS CENTER: A FIVE PERCENT (5%) MATCH BEING REQUIRED BY THE CITY.

WHEREAS, the Owensboro-Daviess County Centralized 911 Communications seeks to file an application for a FY2018 Competitive Grant through the Kentucky 911 Service Boards in the approximate amount of \$29,337.00, the proceeds of which the City of Owensboro will purchase a Motorola radio call dispatch software license to connect the current dispatch infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, during heavy call volume, radio dispatch channels need to be separated to better utilize personnel and equipment; and

WHEREAS, a five percent (5%) match is required of applicants for this grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY OF OWENSBORO, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to execute a grant application to be filed with the 911 Emergency Service Boards for the FY2018 State 911 Emergency Service Board Program for grant funds in the amount of approximately \$29,337.00, the proceeds of which the City of Owensboro will purchase a

Motorola radio call dispatch software license, for which a five percent (5%) match shall be required from the City.

Section 2. That the Mayor, City Manager and appropriate staff members are hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all other agreements, instruments or documents necessary and appropriate to effectuate and implement any grants awarded to the City.
