Dayton schools sue, accuse state of 'spite' in Dunbar forfeit; OHSAA issues statement

The director of communications for the Ohio High School Athletic Association, Tim Stried, issued a statement Friday on behalf of the organization:

"It is never something that the OHSAA wants to do, in terms of removing a school from any tournament. We feel terrible abut the fact that that was needed to happen. Our executive Director, Dr. Dan Ross, made it very clear that he felt terrible that we needed to do this. However, our member schools do have these by laws put in place and it is the OHSAA's job to enforce them."

The school board's legal filing Friday claims that OHSAA's ruling was "without either factual or legal basis" and that its conclusions are "motivated by spite, ill will, and/or a desire to do harm to DPS and Dunbar High School students."

Dayton sought a temporary restraining order in Montgomery County Common Pleas Court. If approved, it would allow the Dunbar High School boys basketball team to compete in the postseason tournament. The challenge came one day after the Ohio High School Athletic Association removed them from that tournament.

Sunday's tournament game has been suspended, pending the legal action, and officials said it will be rescheduled to 9:30 p.m. Wednesday. Originally, Dunbar was to play Fenwick, but the OHSAA ruled Dunbar out and reinstated Thurgood Marshall, which had lost in the last round to Dunbar.

The OHSAA cited Dunbar's use of an ineligible player in its last tournament game, and the school's failure to enforce suspensions against multiple junior varsity players stemming from a Jan. 10 on-court fight during a game.

In its court filing Friday, Dayton Public Schools included an affidavit from Dunbar junior varsity coach Donnovan Brown. Brown claims that a "John Doe" player who splits time between the junior varsity and varsity teams is the player OHSAA said should have been suspended, but played in a Dunbar tournament game Feb. 23.

Brown says in his affidavit that he watched video of the altercation twice – the day after it happened and again this week – and the "John Doe" player was not involved in the fight, so he was not suspended.

In the primary court complaint, DPS' attorney wrote that "at no point between Jan. 10, 2018, and Feb. 23, 2018, did any OHSAA official advise DPS administrators at either Dunbar or Thurgood Marshall that all players leaving the bench area during the altercation were or should have been suspended for two games."







Miami County engineer asks commissioners to OK \$5 license fee hike

Miami County engineer wants the commissioners to increase license fees by \$5 to help generate money for road repairs and paving. Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles

Those responsible for caring for Miami County's roads are pleased they've been able to expand the county paving program in recent years, but could do a lot more with an added \$5 annual license fee allowed by the state legislature, County Engineer Paul Huelskamp said Tuesday, in presenting his annual report.

Huelskamp "respectfully" requested the county commissioners to consider an August 2017 letter he submitted discussing the provision to add onto the annual vehicle registration fee, a move he said would generate another \$600,000 each year.

The \$5 added tax to register a vehicle was approved last month in Montgomery County, where it will become effective Jan. 1, 2019 and is expected to raise \$2 million more annually for projects.

The commissioners heard Huelskamp's report and commended his department for its efforts, particularly the leveraging of local funds with state and federal grants for road and bridge projects. The commissioners did not discuss the fee proposal Tuesday. The state law allows counties, but not other governments, to pass the tax following public hearings.

In the annual report, Huelskamp said the county paved 24.55 miles in 2017 at a cost of \$1,642,670. He noted, though, the county has 423.5 miles of roads under its care and the industry standard for paving cycles is 10 years. To meet that standard, the county would need to pave about 42.35 miles per year.

In the 2017 letter, Huelskamp said the added money would help the county to get to a 15-year cycle.

Commissioner Greg Simmons asked what other counties had taken advantage of the additional tax.

The \$5 added tax has been passed by several larger counties while a few others have scheduled required public hearings.


"The larger counties are the ones that have already (passed the tax)," Huelskamp said.

The county the past couple of years could pave more miles because of mild winters and aggressive pursuit of alternative funding, Huelskamp said. Lower salt costs were a factor. This winter, the county spent \$250,427 through Feb. 7 on snow removal.



West Carrollton police investigate infant death, possible assault

WEST CARROLLTON — A newborn brought to Dayton Children's Hospital in reported "serious condition" Monday night has died, according to West Carrollton police and the Montgomery County Coroner's office.

The 10-day-old baby girl was pronounced dead at the hospital at approximately 2 a.m. Tuesday, according to the coroner's office.

Police said they are now working to determine the circumstances that led to the infant's death, and would not comment further.

This newsroom obtained the initial call for service record which listed the incident as an assault.

West Carrollton police initially responded to the hospital around 8:45 p.m. Monday after being contacted by a social worker from the hospital. According to the call for service report, the social worker reported to police "they have a 10-day old baby with non-accidental trauma."

The Montgomery County Coroner's office said the cause and manner of the baby's death are pending. No arrests have been made and no criminal charges have been filed.

West Carrollton police said they are working with Middletown police in the investigation.
