Action/Discussion Item:

Approval of the 2017 Report, 2017 Exceptions, and 2019 Plan as Required by 702 KAR 1:115, Annual Inservice Training of District Board Members

Commissioner's Recommendation:

The Commissioner recommends approval of the 2017 Report, 2017 Exceptions and 2019 Plan.

Rationale:

To approve these items, as required by 702 KAR 1:115.

The recommendation for approval is made because:

- The 2017 Report is complete and accurate and reflects in-service training offerings that comply with regulation specifications;
- The requests for extensions for board members needing additional time to complete 2017 requirements are justified and within the provisions of the statute.
- The recommended 2019 Plan meets and exceeds regulation specifications.
- The board must meet the requirements of 702 KAR 1:115 in regard to those who do not fulfill training requirements and were not granted an extension.

Action Question:

Should the Kentucky Board of Education (KBE):

- 1) accept the 2017 District Board Member In-Service Training Report;
- 2) grant an extension of time to complete the 2017 requirements to board members appointed after March 1, 2017 who did not complete the 2017 requirements;
- 3) approve the 2019 In-Service Training Plan; and
- 4) take action regarding any members not granted an extension due to not fulfilling the training requirements by notifying them of the date when they will be reported to the Attorney General

Applicable Statute or Regulation:

KRS 160.180 (with references to KRS 156.031; KRS 156.070)

History/Background:

Existing Policy. Kentucky Revised Statute 160.180 requires that school board members complete annual (calendar year) in-service training. For board members in office as of December 31, 2014, twelve hours are required during each of the first four years of district board service; eight hours during each of the second four years; and four hours each year thereafter. For board members beginning service on or after January 1, 2015, twelve hours are required during each of the first eight years of district board service and eight hours each year thereafter. Additionally, board members are required to obtain training in the areas of finance, ethics and superintendent evaluation as follows:

- For board members with 0-3 years of experience, annual training must include:
 - o Three (3) hours of school finance
 - o One (1) hour of ethics

- o One (1) hour of superintendent evaluation training each year
- For board members with 4 7 years of experience, annual training must include:
 - o Two (2) hours of school finance
 - One (1) hour of ethics training
 - One (1) hour of superintendent evaluation training each year
- For board members with 8 or more years of experience, annual training must include:
 - o One (1) hour of school finance training each year
 - o One (1) hour of ethics training each year
 - o One (1) hour of superintendent evaluation training biennially

Summary: The Kentucky School Boards Association (KSBA) collects and keeps corresponding records and is recognized as the provider of eight of the twelve hours required during each of the first four years of service. 702 KAR 1:115 requires the KSBA to submit to the Kentucky Board of Education for review and approval the following:

- -in-service training summary on an annual basis (Attachments A, B and C);
- -a request for an extension of time for completing required in-service training hours in individual cases where warranted (Attachment D); and
- -annual in-service training plan for 2019 (Attachment F).

These items are attached.

The annual in-service training plan for 2017 is also attached for information only (Attachment E).

Additionally, the board needs to be aware that 702 KAR 1:115 says in Section 3: "Subject to extensions granted under Section 4 of this administrative regulation, the names of all district school board members who fail to complete the required hours of in-service training shall be transmitted by the Department of Education to the Attorney General." For these individuals, see Attachment D.

Budget Impact: There is minimal impact to the P-12 budget for legal review and staff time to enforce training requirements for those local board members not meeting minimum requirements.
