### 2017-18 Council Major Points of Action

Consulted on the hiring of a preschool teacher, a preschool instructional assistant, evening custodian, ESS daytime-waiver instructional assistants and a half-time instructional assistant for the 2017-18 school year. The council also consulted on the hiring of an elementary teacher for the upcoming 2018-19 year.

Approved revisions to the 17-18 Title I, Instructional Resources, and ESS budgets, as well as approval for the 2018-19 PPA, Title I, and ESS budgets.

Requested a review of current SBDM Bylaws and Policies from KASC and will begin taking action by addressing necessary bylaw changes starting in June 2018.

Discussed and approved proposed ESS and Title I program descriptions for the upcoming school year. Reviewed data presented on the 2017-18 programs.

Approved allocations and a grade level staffing plan for the upcoming year to maximize staff impact on student achievement.

Made adjustments to the master schedule prior to the start of the 2017-18 school year to allow for appropriate KSI intervention services.

Approved professional development plan for the 2018-19 school year.

Reviewed and approved FRYSC Continuation Program Plan

Approved all required components for the new Comprehensive School Improvement Plan

Reviewed Common Assessment plan to begin scrimmage tests for 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> students in advance of KPREP

Addressed and approved use of school space for the 2017-18 school year.

Approved creation of a writing committee to increase school-wide focus on writing across all grade levels.

Reviewed MAP, KPREP, and other pieces of data to discuss student achievement and growth occurring across all grade levels

## **Success Stories**

The following are just a few of the successes of the Creekside Elementary community from the 2017-18 school year:

- The Academic Team had five individual students place at the Governor's Cup District Competition and advance to the Regional. The Future Problem Solving Team also finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place and advanced.
- At the Governor's Cup Regional competition, the Future Problem Solving Team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall.
- The 4<sup>th</sup> grade boys' basketball team was winner of the district championship and continued on to compete in an Elizabethtown league securing a second championship for the season.
- The girls' volleyball team went undefeated in the regular season and was the runner-up in the conference tournament.
- The Beta Club hosted a recognition breakfast in honor of local community leaders.
- Honored the military community and our Partner in Education, the Human Resources Command-Officer Personnel Management Directorate, during a Veterans Day event.
- 5<sup>th</sup> grader Caleb Coogle won the school spelling bee and went on to compete in the Hardin County Spelling Bee, as well competing and finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> place at the North Central Kentucky Spelling Bowl.
- The fitness team had three medalists at the Marine Corp Physical Fitness event and the intermediate team finished second overall.
- Held a Math and Chili Parent Night where all students, PreK-5<sup>th</sup> grade, played mathematics games with their families.
- Hosted two Wellness Nights and partnered with outside agencies, to promote healthy living.
- Hosted Career Day, which brought in professionals and agencies across the region, to expose students to new and innovative career opportunities.
- VEX Robotics Team D (Brayden Coley, Jayden Wyatt, Chase Fogle, Annabelle Orton ) received the Judges Award at the Creekside Elementary VEX Robotics Competition.
- Held the first Spring Arts Expo where students across all grade levels were invited to share their talents in the areas of music and art.
- Reinstituted scrimmage KPREP tests in the spring for all students in grades 3-5.
- Club Day, a part of the school's PBIS initiative, provided K-5 students with an opportunity to explore a variety of interests while being recognized for their exceptional behavior. These club days were held the final Friday of each calendar month.
- Gains were made in both reading and math MAP scores, compared with the previous year's data.

- Served approximately 100 students through the school's ESS program, between both daytime waiver and afterschool services.
- Established a partnership with the Hardin County Public Library to bring the Bookmobile on campus twice weekly during summer 2018.
- Celebrated student successes at quarterly awards ceremonies.
- Held a KPREP "Olympics" themed rally and weekly events in the month preceding KPREP tests.
  All students in grades 3-5 and all staff were provided with blue Olympic designed Bruin shirts to wear during testing.
- The Upton Masonic Lodge donated six bicycles to award students with perfect attendance during the third and fourth quarters.
- Offered opportunities for all parents to join committees that previous did not have parent representation.
