§ 10.01 INTERPRETATION.

(A) The provisions of this and subsequent chapters in this volume shall constitute and be designated and cited as "The Morehead Code of 1977."

(B) Unless otherwise provided herein, or by law or implication required, the same rules of construction, definition, and application shall govern the interpretation of this code as those governing the interpretation of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

(C) Statutory footnotes, cross-references, and other comments are by way of explanation only and should not be deemed a part of the text of any section.

(D) All provisions of this code are limited in application to the territorial boundaries of the municipal corporation although the same may not be so limited specifically.

§ 10.02 APPLICATION TO FUTURE LEGISLATION.

All of the provisions of Title I, not incompatible with future legislation, shall apply to ordinances hereafter adopted, amending, or supplementing this code unless otherwise specifically provided.

§ 10.03 CAPTIONS.

Headings and captions used in this code other than the title, chapter, and section numbers, are employed for reference purposes only and shall not be deemed a part of the text of any section.

§ 10.04 DEFINITIONS; RULES OF CONSTRUCTION.

(A) Definitions. For the purpose of this code, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

"ACTION." Includes all proceedings in any court of this state.
(KRS 446.010(1))

"AND." May be read "OR," and "OR" may be read "AND," if the sense requires it.

"ANIMAL." Includes every warm-blooded living creature except a human being. (KRS 446.010(2))

"AVIS." The automated vehicle information system established and maintained by the Transportation Cabinet to collect titling and registration information on vehicles and boat and information on holders of motor vehicle operator's licenses and personal identification cards. (KRS 446.010(55))

"BUSINESS TRUST." Includes, except when utilized in KRS Chapter 386, a "statutory trust" as organized under KRS Chapter 386A. (KRS 446.010(6))

"CERTIFIED MAIL." Any method of governmental, commercial, or electronic delivery that allows a document or package to have proof of:

- (1) Sending the document or package;
 - (2) The date the document or package was delivered or delivery was attempted; and
 - (3) The signature of the receipt of the document or package.
- (KRS 446.010(8))

"CITY," "MUNICIPAL CORPORATION," or "MUNICIPALITY." When used in this code shall denote the City of Morehead irrespective of its population or legal classification.

"CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER." A city police officer, safety officer, citation officer, building inspector, fire chief or other public law enforcement officer with the authority to issue a citation. (Ord. 16:97, passed 7-14-97)

"COMPANY." May extend and be applied to any corporation, company, person, partnership, joint stock company, or association.
(KRS 446.010(9))

"CORPORATION." May extend and be applied to any corporation, company, partnership, joint stock company, or association.
(KRS 446.010(10))

"COUNCIL," "BOARD or COUNCIL," or "COMMON COUNCIL." The city legislative body. (KRS 83A.010(5))

"COUNTY." Rowan County, Kentucky.

"CRUELTY." As applied to animals, includes every act or omission whereby unjustifiable physical pain, suffering, or death is caused or permitted. (KRS 446.010(12))

"DIRECTORS." When applied to corporations, includes managers or trustees. (KRS 446.010(13))

"DOMESTIC." When applied to a corporation, partnership, business trust, or limited liability company, means all those incorporated or formed by authority of this state. (KRS 446.010(14))

"DOMESTIC ANIMAL." Any animal converted to domestic habitat. (KRS 446.010(15))

"EXECUTIVE AUTHORITY." The Mayor. (KRS 83A.010(6))

"EXECUTIVE ORDER." An order issued by the Mayor which is binding upon the officers and employees of the city and any governmental agency over which the city has jurisdiction. (KRS 83A.010(7))

"FEDERAL." Refers to the United States. (KRS 446.010(17))

"FOREIGN." When applied to a corporation, partnership, limited partnership, business trust, statutory trust, or limited liability company, includes all those incorporated or formed by authority of any other state. (KRS 446.010(18))

"KEEPER" or "PROPRIETOR." Includes all persons, whether acting by themselves or as a servant, agent or employee.

"KRS." Kentucky Revised Statutes.

"LAND" or "REAL ESTATE." Includes lands, tenements, and hereditaments and all rights thereto and interest therein, other than a chattel interest. (KRS 446.010(23))

"LEGISLATIVE BODY." The City Council. (KRS 91A.010(8))

"LEGISLATIVE BODY MEMBER." A City Councilman. (KRS 83A.010(8))

"LIVESTOCK." Cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, alpacas, llamas, buffaloes, or any other animals of the bovine, ovine, porcine, caprine, equine, or camelid species. (KRS 446.010(25))

"MAY." The act referred to is permissive. (KRS 446.010(26))

"MISDEMEANOR." An offense for which the criminal fine cannot exceed the amount set forth in KRS 534.040(2)(a), or a term of imprisonment not to exceed the periods set forth in KRS 532.090(1) or both. (KRS 83A.065)

"MONTH." Calendar month. (KRS 446.010(27))

"MUNICIPAL ORDER." An official act of the City Council which is binding upon the officers and employees of the city and any governmental agency over which the city has jurisdiction. (KRS 83A.010(9))

"MUNICIPALITY." The City of Morehead, Kentucky.

"OATH." Includes "AFFIRMATION" in all cases in which an affirmation may be substituted for an oath. (KRS 446.010(28))

"OFFICER." Any person elected to a position by the voters or any person appointed to a position which:

(a) Is created by the Constitution, the General Assembly, or a city;

(b) Possesses a delegation of a portion of the sovereign power of government;

(c) Has powers and duties to be discharged which are conferred directly or by implication by the city;

(d) Has duties performed independently and without control of a superior power other than the law;

(e) Has some permanency;

(f) Requires an official oath;

(g) Is assigned by a commission or other written authority; and

(h) Provides for an official bond if required by proper authority.
(KRS 83A.010(10))

"ORDINANCE." An official act of a city legislative body, which is a regulation of a general and permanent nature and enforceable as a local law or is an appropriation of money. (KRS 83A.010(11))

"PARTNERSHIP." Includes both general and limited partnerships.
(KRS 446.010(30))

"PEACE OFFICER." Includes sheriffs, constables, coroners, jailers, metropolitan and urban-county government correctional officers, marshals, policemen, and other persons with similar authority to make arrests. (KRS 446.010(31))

"PERSON." May extend and be applied to bodies-politic and corporate, societies, communities, the public generally, individuals, partnerships, joint stock companies, and limited liability companies.
(KRS 446.010(33))

"PERSONAL PROPERTY." Includes all property except real.

"PREMISES." As applied to property, includes land and buildings.

"PROPERTY." Includes real, personal, mixed estates and interests.

MUNICIPAL HOUSING COMMISSION

§ 34.05 CREATION OF MUNICIPAL HOUSING COMMISSION.

(A) A housing commission is created for the city. The name of the commission shall be the Morehead Municipal Housing Commission.

(B) The members of the Municipal Housing Commission shall serve without pay but shall be entitled to necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties. (Ord. passed 3-25-58)

URBAN RENEWAL AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

§ 34.15 CREATION OF URBAN RENEWAL AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

(A) The City Council, with the passage of this resolution, creates an agency as authorized by KRS 99.350.

(B) The agency as created shall have all powers, functions, and duties but only those powers, functions, and duties authorized by KRS 99.350 to 99.590.

(C) The agency herein created shall be known as the Urban Renewal and Community Development Agency of the city. (Ord. passed 7-10-62)

RECREATION COMMISSION

§ 34.20 CREATION OF BOARD.

There is created an advisory commission known as the Morehead Recreation Commission. The Commission shall act in the capacity of advisor to the Council in matters including, but not limited to, all aspects of operation of the city recreation park. (Ord. passed 11-13-62; Am. Ord. passed 5-8-78)

§ 34.21 LENGTH OF TERMS.

The Commission shall consist of five (5) persons to be appointed by the Mayor and to serve for a term of four (4) years or until their successors are appointed, except that the members first appointed shall be: one (1) for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, one (1) for three (3) years, and two (2) for four (4) years. (Ord. passed 11-13-62)

JOINT PLANNING COMMISSION

§ 34.25 ESTABLISHMENT.

In order to guide and accomplish the coordinated and harmonious development of the City of Morehead, County of Rowan and City of Lakeview Heights, which will, in accordance with existing and future needs, best promote public health, safety, order, convenience, prosperity and the general welfare as well as efficiency and economy in the process of development, hereby create a commission which shall be known as the Morehead-Lakeview Heights-County of Rowan Joint Planning Commission, hereinafter referred to as "Joint Planning Commission". The appointment and subsequent approval of members, election of

officers, and adoption of its bylaws, its existence shall begin subject to the provisions of KRS Chapter 100. The Commission may engage in planning operations within its jurisdiction which shall be coterminous with its political boundary except where otherwise provided for by KRS Chapter 100.131.

§ 34.26 MEMBERSHIP.

(A) The Joint Planning Commission shall consist of nine (9) members. The Mayor of the City of Morehead shall appoint three (3) members who are residents of the City of Morehead, to be approved by the Board of City Council of the City of Morehead, Kentucky. The Mayor of Lakeview Heights shall appoint three (3) members who represent the City of Lakeview Heights, to be approved by the Commission. The Judge Executive of the County of Rowan shall appoint three (3) members who are residents of the County of Rowan, to be approved by the Rowan County Fiscal Court. The oath of office shall be administered to all members of the Commission before entering upon their duties. The oath shall be administered as provided by law.

(B) The term of office of the members shall be four (4) years, and until their successors take office. However, no member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive four (4) year terms.

(C) All vacancies, whether by resignation, dismissal, or expiration of the term of office, shall be filled within sixty (60) days by the appropriate appointing authority or as otherwise provided for in KRS 100.147. A member may be removed by the appropriate appointing authority for inefficiency, neglect of duty, malfeasance, or conflict of interest. The removed member shall have the right of appeal in the manner prescribed by KRS 100.157.

(D) Members shall serve without compensation, but reimbursement of expenses may be authorized.

§ 34.27 OFFICERS.

The Commission shall elect, from among its members, a chairperson and vice-chairperson. In the absence of the chairperson, the vice-chairperson shall act and have all the powers and duties of the chairperson. The terms of the chairperson and vice-chairperson shall each be for one (1) year.

§ 34.28 MEETINGS.

The Commission shall conduct regular monthly meetings for the transaction of its business. The bylaws adopted by the Commission shall reflect the schedule of regular meetings, the manner in which notice shall be given, date, time, place, and the subject or subjects to be discussed, as well as the method of calling and conducting

special meetings. A simple majority of the total membership shall constitute a quorum. After a quorum has been established, a simple majority of that quorum can transact any official business except in those instances where there is to be an adoption or amendment of the Commission's by-laws or elements of the comprehensive plan or regulations; then a vote of the simple majority of the total membership shall be necessary.

§ 34.29 BYLAWS AND MINUTES.

The Commission shall adopt and approve its by-laws before it may properly transact any business. The by-laws shall set forth the procedures, rules, and regulations necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. The by-laws shall describe the method for administration of funds should the legislative bodies of the joint commission appropriate said funds and provide for an annual audit thereof, if required. The Commission shall keep minutes and records of all proceedings, including regulations, transactions, findings, and determinations and the number of votes for and against each question, and if any member is absent or disqualifies from voting, indicating the fact, all of which shall immediately after adoption be filed in the office of the county clerk as required by KRS 100.167.

§ 34.30 POWERS AND DUTIES.

(A) The Commission shall have general powers necessary to carry out its functions in accordance with this section and KRS Chapter 100. The Commission may be assigned any powers, duties and functions related to urban renewal or public housing by the legislative body of the City of Morehead, City of Lakeview Heights or the County of Rowan.

(B) The commission shall have the following additional power to review and, approve or reject any of the following developments and constructions:

(1) A subdivision as established and defined by KRS Chapter 100.111;

(2) Any development consisting of three or more dwelling units per parcel. A dwelling unit is defined as a structure or the part of a structure that is used as a home, residence, or sleeping place by one (1) person who maintains a household or by two (2) or more persons who maintain a common household.

(3) Any business, commercial, industrial or public zone construction development;

(4) Any construction of any structure more than three (3) stories or thirty (30) feet in height in any zone;

(5) Any construction of any live entertainment facility;

(6) Any new mobile home park development.

(7) Any change of use.

(C) With regard to the powers listed in division (B) above, the applicant shall submit a preliminary development plan and a final plan to the Commission as outlined in §§ 154.232 through 154.234 of the City of Morehead Code of Ordinances. The commission may waive the requirement of submission of said preliminary development plan. (Ord. passed 11-10-70; Am. Ord. 01:2000, passed 2-14-00; Am. Ord. 02:2000, passed 2-14-00; Am. RECREATIONAL, TOURIST, AND CONVENTION COMMISSION

§ 34.35 CREATION OF COMMISSION.

There is created, pursuant to KRS 91A.350 and 91A.360, the City of Morehead Recreational, Tourist, and Convention Commission, which commission is established for the purpose of promoting recreational, tourist, and convention activity in Morehead and Rowan County. (Ord. passed 10-13-75; Am. Ord. 35:2008, passed 10-13-08)

§ 34.36 COMPENSATION; NUMBER OF MEMBERS.

The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members who shall service without compensation and who shall be citizens, residents, and voters of Rowan County who shall be appointed by the Mayor of the city as follows:

(A) Two (2) Commissioners from a list of not less than four (4) names submitted by the local city hotel and motel association.

(C) One (1) Commissioner from a list of not less than two (2) names submitted by the local restaurant association or associations.

(D) One (1) Commissioner from a list of not less than two (2) names submitted by the Morehead-Rowan County Chamber of Commerce.

(E) Two (2) Commissioners to be appointed by the Mayor of the city.

(F) In the absence of any of the above-named associations, or in the event that any association fails to submit the list, the Mayor of the city shall make the necessary appointments so that the Commission shall at all times be composed of seven (7) members.

(G) In the event that the city and county governments should ever organize a joint city-county Recreational, Tourist, and Convention Commission, then the appointments shall be made in conformity with KRS Chapter 91A.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

§ 39.15 PURPOSE.

Use of internet social media sites is a popular activity. Employees are permitted to use personal social networking; however, employees must be mindful of the negative impact of inappropriate or unauthorized postings upon the City of Morehead and its relationship with the community. The purpose of this policy is to give employees guidance regarding inappropriate content for personal social media websites, web pages, and other electronically transmitted or hard copied material with respect to the city and to clearly identify prohibited activities by employees both on and off duty in order to protect the City of Morehead, its employees and Board of Council from harm as the result of inappropriate postings or inadvertent harmful postings. This policy is not meant to address one particular form of social media; rather social media in general, as advances in technology will occur and new tools will emerge. Further, the policy is not intended to hinder professional development of any employee or interfere with an employee's First Amendment rights.

§ 39.16 POLICY.

The City of Morehead recognizes that social media provides a new and potentially valuable means of assisting the City of Morehead and its personnel in meeting community outreach, problem-solving, investigation, crime prevention, and related objectives. This policy identifies potential uses that may be explored or expanded upon as deemed reasonable by administrative and supervisory personnel. Further, the City of Morehead recognizes the role that these tools play in the lives of city government employee, both in their personal lives and official capacity and acknowledges that its employees have the right under the First Amendment, in certain circumstances, to speak out on matters of public concern not related to their official duties. However, the city will regulate the use of social media by employees, including employees' personal use of social media, when such use interferes with or disrupts the work of the city, is used to harass coworkers or other members of city government, breaches confidentiality obligations of city employees, creates a hostile work environment or violates the law or city policies/ordinances.

§ 51.01 GAS AND WATER TAP CHARGES.

(A) No free use of the services and facilities of the municipal utility system of the city (hereinafter the "system") shall be granted or permitted to any user thereof, including the City of Morehead.

(B) Effective July 1, 2016, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any water line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for residential purposes shall be eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) each for such water tap.

(C) Effective September 1, 2009, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any water line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for industrial or commercial purposes shall be the actual cost of labor and material incurred by the Morehead Utility Plant Board.

(D) Effective July 1, 2016, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any gas line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for residential purposes shall be seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) each for such gas tap.

(E) Effective September 1, 2009, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any gas line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for industrial or commercial purposes shall be the actual cost of labor and material incurred by the Morehead Utility Plant Board.

(F) Upon payment of the connection or tapping charge the Morehead Utility Plant Board shall cause the connection or tapping to be made.

(G) Any party making any connection without payment of the connection or tapping charge or violating any provision of this section, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and each day's violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

§ 51.02 SERVICE RATES AND CHARGES.

(A) Rates and charges for the use of the water and gas services and facilities of the system shall be based on the consumption of water, and rates and charges for the use of the gas services and facilities of the system shall be based on the consumption of gas. Rates and charges shall be at least adequate to meet the cost of maintaining, repairing, and operating the system, and making required principal and interest payments and deposits to the debt service or depreciation reserve. On that basis, monthly rates and charges are established and fixed, and will be maintained, at not less than the following:

(A) Effective July 1, 2016, any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any residential sewer line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board shall first pay to the Morehead Utility Plant Board a connection or tapping charge as follows:

(1) Gravity. Eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the first tap and two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each additional tap made off of the service line from the first tap.

(2) Grinder Pump. Three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) each for such tap.

No reduction in wastewater service charges, fees, or taxes shall be permitted because of the fact that certain wastes discharged to the wastewater works contain less than normal domestic wastewater contaminant limits.

(1) An application fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall accompany each permit application to cover the cost of the discharge permit for a period of one (1) year. New permit applications received during the year shall be pro-rated based on the number of full months remaining in the year;

(5) Other fees and expenses for all costs incurred by the MUPB to carry out the requirements contained in this chapter may be assessed.

§ 52.80 RIGHT TO ENTER PREMISES.

The General Superintendent and other duly authorized employees and representatives of the city and authorized representatives of applicable federal and state regulatory agencies bearing proper credentials and identification shall be permitted to enter all properties for the purpose of inspection, observation, records examination and copying, measurement, sampling, and testing pertinent to discharges to the public sewer system in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

§ 52.81 RIGHT TO OBTAIN INFORMATION REGARDING DISCHARGE.

Duly authorized representatives of the city and representatives of the state and EPA are authorized to obtain information including but not limited to copying of records concerning character, strength and quantity of industrial wastes which have a direct bearing on the kind and source of discharge to the wastewater collection system.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 93.01 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DISTURBANCE OF CITY STREETS/ROADWAYS AND SIDEWALKS.

(A) Prior to the commencement of any work that involves the disturbance of any street/roadway within the city, it is required that the proper agencies of the city be notified, including, but not limited to the following: Department of Public Works, Police Department, Fire Department, and Office of Planning/Inspections.

(B) All necessary permits, licenses, bonding and insurance shall be obtained and proof thereof provided to the Office of Planning/Inspections of the city.

(C) All federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations pertaining to safety of either the public or workers shall be strictly observed.

(D) It shall be responsibility of contractor performing said work to provide personnel, signage and barricades as needed to provide traffic control and warning indicators to the public.

(E) A city street/roadway may not remain closed at the end of a workday. In the event the roadway being disturbed is the only access to an area of the city, provisions must be made to allow passage by the public at regular intervals with blockages not to exceed a five-minute wait. Exceptions may be granted on a case-by-case basis by the Office of Planning/Inspections. With regard to disturbances of sidewalks, provisions shall be made to accommodate passage or pedestrian traffic.

(F) If the disturbance of the roadway involves placing or replacing of piping under the roadway, the following is required: Pipe shall be covered with one (1) foot of #9 stone followed by compacted layers of dense grade aggregate (DGA) in eight (8) inch layers (see attached drawing). For temporary purposes, this may continue to road surface. When the project is ready for final repair of road surface, the DGA must be removed so as to accommodate two (2) inches of asphalt binder and one and one-half (1 1/2) inches of surface wear coat. If roadway is concrete surfaced, the repaired area must also be concrete.

(G) Sidewalks shall be replaced with 4,000 psi concrete placed on stabilized fill to conform to adjoining sidewalks. Timely restoration of sidewalks is required.

§ 93.02 CURB RAMPING FOR THE DISABLED AND ELDERLY.

(A) All new curbs and all existing curbs which are part of any reconstruction, regardless of the location, shall comply with the provisions of (B) below.

(B) In order to enable persons using wheelchairs to travel freely and without assistance at each crosswalk, a ramp with nonslip surface shall be built into the curb so that the sidewalk and street blend to a common level. The bottom of the ramp and the street shall meet. There shall be no lip permitted at the ramp bottom. Such ramp shall not be less than 32 inches wide and shall not have a slope greater than one inch rise per 12 inches length, where practicable.

§ 93.03 RESERVED.

§ 93.04 GUIDELINES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF PRIVATELY OWNED STREETS/ROADWAYS AND EASEMENTS.

(A) Pursuant to KRS 82.400, should any person desire to offer for dedication by recorded plat any public way or easement within the city

(7) Any dead-end street, whether commercial or residential, presented for acceptance by the city shall terminate with an approved cul-de-sac or other approved turn around.

(E) Specifications for New Residential Streets/Roadways.

(1) The sub grade for streets/roadway shall be made from suitable materials free from stumps, trees, vegetation, top soil, etc. Excavation and backfill should be placed to conform to Kentucky Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.

(2) All streets/roadways shall have a minimum paved width of eighteen (18) linear feet with a surface consisting of a six (6) inch compacted mat of crushed stone base (DGA), a two (2) inch compacted mat of bituminous binder and a one (1) inch compacted mat of bituminous surface. Bituminous tack coat shall be applied between bind and surface installation at a minimum of .15 gallon/square yards. These requirements may be increased by the city depending on the traffic flow expected on said street/roadway.

(a) All crushed stone base and asphalt paving used shall conform to requirements contained in Kentucky Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction and shall be installed according to said specifications.

(b) Owner/contractor to certify that material meets Kentucky Department of Transportation specifications prior to final inspection and prior to city's acceptance of street/roadway.

(c) Weigh sheets and tickets are to be supplied to verify tonnage prior to final inspection and prior to city's acceptance of street/roadway.

(3) All streets/roadways shall have a two (2) foot shoulder and be ditched on each side.

(4) All driveway entrances are to have a two (2) foot wide paved entrance apron and a tile sized for proper drainage where drainage runs through the driveway, (a minimum of fifteen (15) inches).

(5) Ditchline culverts must have 24" x 24" surface water catch basins every forty (40) feet unless alternative designs are approved in writing by the Director of Public Works and the city Building Inspector. All culverts that run under a paved road must be certified by a hydrologist or qualified engineer as to the sufficiency of the drainage system.

(6) All culverts that run under a paved street/road must be certified by a hydrologist or qualified engineer as to the sufficiency of the drainage system.

(F) In addition to the requirements provided herein, all roadways, streets and bridges shall be constructed in accordance with the Kentucky Department of Transportation (K-DOT) Standard Specifications for road and bridge construction and said K-DOT Standard Specifications are hereby adopted by reference.

OBSTRUCTION

§ 93.05 DEFINITION.

As used in this chapter the following definition shall apply.

"SIDEWALK." That paved portion in front of any building or lot capable of being used by persons on foot, and any unpaved strip between any paved sidewalk and the curb.

§ 93.06 MERCHANDISE ON SIDEWALK OR STREET PROHIBITED; EXCEPTION.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation, as owner or occupant of any building adjoining any sidewalk or street within the corporate limits of the city, to display or permit to be displayed in any manner any goods, wares, merchandise, or any other thing or object upon the sidewalk, space between the sidewalk and the curb or street; except, however, the city may set aside two (2) full days each year upon recommendation of the Morehead Chamber of Commerce at which time such display of merchandise upon sidewalks or streets may be permitted. § 93.07 REMOVAL OF MERCHANDISE FROM SIDEWALK OR STREET; TIME LIMITATION.

Any goods, merchandise, or equipment that may be necessary to unload from a truck or other conveyance upon any sidewalk or street or in front of any store or building, shall be moved within said building by the consignee within two hours after each delivery.

§ 93.08 UNPACKING MERCHANDISE ON SIDEWALK OR STREET; REQUIREMENTS.

Any goods, merchandise, or equipment that may be unpacked before removing into any building by the consignee shall be done with due care to cause no hazard whereby persons using the sidewalk or street might be injured and to leave no crating lying on the sidewalk in a hazardous manner, and shall remove all boxes, paper, or other packing materials immediately after unpacking. Such packing papers or materials shall not be scattered upon any street or public way.

§ 93.09 REMOVAL OF LITTER OR GARBAGE ON SIDEWALK OR STREET.

All property owners or tenants of property abutting a public sidewalk shall be responsible for the prompt removal of all litter or garbage found on sidewalks fronting their property. Placing of removable litter in streets will constitute a violation of this section.

§ 93.10 SWEEPINGS AND DEBRIS ON SIDEWALKS AND STREETS.

No person, firm or corporation shall sweep, rake, throw, or otherwise deposit any leaves, grass or other debris onto any sidewalk, street, alley or road of the city that creates a hazard, except when such debris is placed in a bag or other container for the purpose of a scheduled collection, pickup or city-authorized leaf removal.

§ 93.11 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES.

Any person, firm or corporation needing to block a sidewalk or street for construction purposes shall obtain special permission from the Morehead Police Department.

DRAINAGE AND STREET ACCESS CONTROL

§ 93.15 PERMITS FOR CONSTRUCTION REQUIRED.

(A) Permits shall be required prior to any construction, reconstruction or alteration of any curb-cut or the construction of any driveway or access road to any public street for any reason except for an officially declared emergency from any area, whether a private drive, parking lot access or a new street or road.

(B) A permit shall be required prior to any construction of any drainage facility, culvert, bridge, box culvert, driveway culvert, trench drain or drainage swale on or along any public street or right-of-way or along on any stream, branch, creek or ditch carrying water through two (2) or more properties and where construction or diversion of flow can cause damage to any other property whether up stream or down stream, along or near the proposed construction.

(C) Application for all permits shall be made by the applicant to allow ample time for any necessary investigation or study. The cost of engineering design, hydraulic analysis or additional drainage studies shall be the responsibility of the applicant.

(D) The City Building Inspector shall be responsible for issuing permits, inspections and enforcement regarding this chapter. All applications and permits will be issued through the Building Inspector located at City Hall, 105 East Main Street, Morehead, Kentucky.

§ 93.16 ACCESS AND DRAINAGE CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATIONS.

The following shall be the minimum specifications for the construction of street access and storm water drainage facilities:

(A) Materials for all items of construction of any description or nature shall conform to standards set out in Kentucky D.O.T. specifications, except as herein set out or described. In cases of dispute arising relative to construction method or materials, the Kentucky Standards for Road & Bridge Construction 1994, or the most recent edition, shall govern.

(B) All drains, catch basins, concrete driveway entrance culverts, ditches, swales or any other means of storm water conveyance shall be sized so as not to impede the flow of storm water. The applicant is responsible for determining pre-construction and post-construction flows for all affected drainage facilities. In no case shall post-construction flow exceed the pre-construction flow. Applicants shall submit all appropriate calculations used to verify design.

(C) Calculations shall be based on a twenty-five (25) year return interval, except that no culvert shall be less than fifteen inches (15") in diameter without written consent of the city. Consent may only be granted where calculations conclude a small size will carry the storm water at the location proposed and that a smaller culvert will not create cleaning and maintenance problems.

(D) Where existing drainage facilities, bridges, culverts, trench drains or swales have to be replaced due to failure, danger of failure, or simply wear and tear, they shall be sized and installed according to this subchapter regardless of whether publicly or privately owned and maintained.

(E) No road, drainage ditch, or swale along a public road or on public land may be filled in or altered without a written permit. When culverts are allowed to replace or supplement drainage ditches or swales, sizing of the culverts shall be based on the twenty-five (25) year return interval. Access for cleaning and catch basins shall be required and shall not be spaced in excess of forty (40) foot intervals without written permits. All catch basins shall have an inside horizontal cross measurement at least as large as the diameter of the pipe.

(F) No swale or road drainage ditch shall be filled so that minimum surface flow is above the bottom of the street bedding (minimum 10" below street surface) except with written permission from the city.

(G) Water from parking lots shall not drain onto public streets unless such streets contain a storm water system or curb and gutters capable of carrying away such storm water without allowing the storm water to flow into the traffic carrying areas of the street (no more than two feet (2') into the street from back side of curb). Where storm sewers and drainage ditches are available, trench drains or concrete-paved swales shall be installed at the property line to direct all surface water into the storm sewer or drainage ditches. In no case shall storm water be allowed to enter upon a street or road where it creates puddles, standing water, or where it causes ice to form on the street.

(H) It shall be unlawful for any person to place any fill, dirt, debris, trash, brush, trees or stumps or any other items or materials into any stream that will obstruct, impede, or divert the flow of water or affect the water-carrying capacity of a storm or drainage ditch.

(I) Culverts placed in drainage ditches adjacent to a road or street for a driveway or road intersection shall be a maximum of forty feet (40') in length.

§ 93.17 ENFORCEMENT.

The administration shall have the right to set permit fees to cover the cost of permits and inspections.

§ 93.18 CIVIL DAMAGES.

Any person violating any provision of § 93.15 - 93.16 shall, in addition to the penalty set out in § 93.99, be liable civilly to the city for any expense loss or damage caused to the city by reason of a violation, including not limited to any clean-up, administration or legal expenses.

ROAD AND BRIDGE PROJECTS

§ 93.25 PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED.

Before the city expends state derived tax revenues on a municipal highway, road, street, or bridge it shall hold a hearing in accordance with the provisions of this subchapter to take the sense of the public with regard to the project and to priorities for use of tax moneys for road and bridge projects.
(KRS 174.100)

§ 93.26 NOTICE REQUIREMENTS.

Before the contemplated date of expenditure of state derived tax revenues on a road or bridge by the city, the city shall give notice in the manner required by KRS Chapter 424 of a public hearing to take the sense of the public with regard to road and bridge matters within the city. The hearing shall be held not less than seven (7) nor more than twenty-one (21) days after the first publication of the notice and before beginning work on any project covered by this subchapter.
(KRS 174.100(1))

§ 93.27 PUBLIC MAY TESTIFY; EFFECT OF TESTIMONY.

(A) At the hearing any person may speak with regard to any proposed project, any project which he feels should be built or done which has not been proposed, priorities for completion of projects, and any other matter related to road and bridge projects.

(B) The city shall not be bound by testimony heard at the hearing but shall give due consideration to it.
(KRS 174.100(2), (3))

§ 93.28 HEARING TO BE HELD PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION.

The city shall not begin construction on a road or bridge project wherein state derived tax revenues are involved until the hearing as provided herein has been held.

(KRS 174.100(4))

§ 93.29 SEPARATE HEARING FOR EACH PROJECT NOT REQUIRED.

This subchapter shall not be construed to require a separate hearing for each project. A single hearing encompassing the entire road and bridge program, provided all projects subsequently undertaken have been identified at the hearing, shall meet the requirements of this subchapter.

(KRS 174.100(5))

§ 93.30 EXEMPTIONS FOR HEARING REQUIREMENT.

(A) The provisions of this subchapter shall not apply to emergency repair or replacement of roads or bridges necessitated by natural or man-caused disasters nor to street cleaning or snow removal operations.

(B) The provisions of this subchapter shall not apply to projects which were under construction as of July 15, 1980, unless construction was suspended after that date and the city desires to reactivate the project.

§ 93.99 PENALTY.

(A) Any person, firm, or corporation violating any section of this chapter may be issued a Notice of Violation by a Code Enforcement Officer allowing the offender a specified time to remedy the violation without a fine. If the violation is not remedied, the offender shall be issued a citation by the Code Enforcement Officer. If the Code Enforcement Officer believes that the violation presents a serious threat to the public health, safety, and welfare, or if, in the absence of immediate action, the effects of the violation will be irreparable or irreversible or the violation is a repeated violation, the Code Enforcement Officer may issue a citation with a Notice of Violation. If the citation is not contested by the offender, the following penalties shall apply; however, the Code Enforcement Board may waive all or any portion of said penalty if, in its discretion, the Code Enforcement Board determines that such waiver will promote compliance with Chapter 93.

(1) First Offense: \$100.00

(2) Second Offense: 125.00

(3) All Others: 150.00

(B) If the citation is contested and a hearing before the Code Enforcement Board is required, the following maximum penalties may be imposed at the discretion of the Code Enforcement Board:

(1) First Offense: \$300.00

(2) Second Offense: 400.00

(3) Third Offense: 500.00

§ 94.01 ROWAN COUNTY ASSESSMENT OF 1973 TO BE USED.

The city shall, for the 1973 tax year and each year thereafter, use the annual Rowan County Assessment, as prepared by the office of the Rowan County Property Valuation Administrator for all property situated within the present corporate limits of the city and all extensions thereto, as the basis of all ad valorem tax levies ordered or approved by the city council.

§ 94.02 ASSESSMENT DATE.

The assessment date for all city ad valorem taxes shall be January 1 of each year.

§ 94.03 RATES.

(A) The city tax rate for real property is hereby fixed at 28.1 cents per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation for the tax year 2017.

(B) The city tax rate for personal property is hereby fixed at 38.34 cents per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation for the tax year 2017.

§ 94.04 RATES MAY BE REDUCED.

Any or all city ad valorem tax rates may be reduced by City Council for the years 1973 and following years after City Council has been advised by the Rowan County Property Valuation Administrator of the total amount of the assessed value of property within the city. (Ord. passed 12-13-72)

§ 94.05 PAYMENT OF TAXES.

All taxes paid prior to December 1, 2017, shall be discounted at the rate of two percent (2%) of the tax bill; all taxes paid on or after December 1, 2017 and prior to January 1, 2018, shall bear the net amount of the tax bill; and all taxes not paid before January 1, 2018, shall bear a penalty of eight percent (8%) per annum. A property lien will be filed with the Office of Rowan County Clerk against each property tax bill that remains unpaid as of April 15, 2018; the expense for the filing and release of the lien will be added to the property tax bill.

§ 95.01 HOURS OF OPERATION.

(A) The Don Greenhill City Park, including all baseball fields, skate park and picnic area, shall be opened to the public daily from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., except for recreational sporting events approved by the City of Morehead Director of Recreation. The shelter areas shall be opened to the public during said times so long as said shelters have not been reserved for private use.

(B) Peggies Place shall be opened to public use by reservation only during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

(C) Rodburn Hollow Park shall be opened to the public daily from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. The shelters in said Park shall be opened to the public and for private use by reservation during said times.

§ 95.02 DOG PARK (MOREHEAD BARK PARK).

(A) No dangerous dog shall be permitted to enter upon or into the Dog Park. A dangerous animal is defined as follows:

(1) Any dog that has attacked or bitten without provocation a person engaged in a lawful activity within the city;

(2) Any dog that has killed or injured another dog after the owner thereof has been given written or verbal notice by authorities to keep the dog confined or muzzled; or

(3) Any dog that has been declared to be dangerous by a physician attending a person who has been bitten or attacked by such dog.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person or person to utilize the dog park located in Don Greenhill City Park in a manner which violates the following rules:

(1) Any persons entering the dog park acknowledge the risks and a possible danger associated with dog parks, and assumes the risk of injury to themselves and their dogs.

(2) The hours of operations of the dog park shall be those of Don Greenhill Park.

(3) The dog park is for use of dogs and handlers only. No other animals are permitted in the dog park.

(4) Any dog utilizing the dog park shall display a current rabies tag.

(5) Any dog utilizing the dog park shall display an owner identification tag.

(6) Dogs must be leashed when entering and exiting the dog park.

(7) Only dogs older than four (4) months of age may enter the dog park.

(8) Only dogs current on required vaccinations may enter the dog park.

(9) Female dogs in heat are prohibited from entering the dog park.

(10) Children under the age of thirteen (13) years may not enter the dog park unless accompanied by an adult.

(11) Dog owners or handlers must be inside the dog park, be within view of their dog(s) and have on their person a non-retractable leash no longer than six (6) feet.

(12) Dogs outside of the dog park enclosure must be on a leash. No dogs shall be permitted to run at large outside of the dog park.

(13) Choke, prong, pinch and spike collars are not permitted within the dog park.

(14) Dogs displaying aggressive behaviors are not permitted within the dog park.

(15) Squeaky toys are not permitted with the dog park.

(16) Dog owners or handlers shall pick-up, seal and properly remove their dog's waste.

(17) Dog owners or handlers must fill in any holes their dog digs.

(18) Food, long-lasting dog chews and glass containers are not permitted in the dog park.

(19) No person shall bring into or consume any food with the dog park.

(20) No more than three (3) dogs per person.

(21) Dog trainers are not permitted to use the dog park to conduct business.

(22) Do not brush or otherwise groom dogs inside the park. Pet grooming often produces loose hair which can soil the dog park.

(C) Dog owners or handlers that fail to comply with these rules may be asked to leave by Recreation Personnel or Law Enforcement Officers.

(D) The dog park shall be closed and no dog shall be permitted in the dog park when city personnel are conducting maintenance. No animals shall be permitted with the picnic areas, play areas of the parks or at sporting events held at the parks.

§ 95.03 PROHIBITION AGAINST WATER SPORTS IN OR ON TRIPLETT CREEK.

(A) No swimming or other water contact team sports shall be permitted in or on Triplett Creek at any point within the city.

(B) Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

§ 95.04 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

Except for (i) the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages in conjunction with a city-sponsored event as authorized in writing by the city or (ii) the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages in conjunction with the rental of Peggie's Place in accordance with the rental agreement signed by the parties and proper license to sell, no person shall sell or consume any alcoholic beverages within the city park.

(2) No license shall be issued to any natural person under this chapter if he or she:

(a) Has been convicted of any felony until five (5) years have passed from the date of conviction, release from custody or incarceration, parole, or termination of probation, whichever is later;

(b) Has been convicted of any misdemeanor described under KRS 218A.050, 218A.060, 218A.070, 218A.080, 218A.090, 218A.100, 218A.110, 218A.120, or 218A.130 in the two (2) years immediately preceding the application;

(c) Has been convicted of any misdemeanor directly or indirectly attributable to the use of alcoholic beverages in the two (2) years immediately preceding the application; or

(d) Has had any license issued under this ordinance relating to the regulation of the manufacture, sale, and transportation of alcoholic beverages revoked for cause or has been convicted of a violation of any such Kentucky Revised statute relating to the manufacture, sale and transportation of alcoholic beverages, until the expiration of two (2) years from the date of the revocation or conviction;

(e) Is under the age of twenty-one (21) years;

(f) Is not a citizen of the United States and has not been an actual, bona fide resident in this state for at least one (1) year before the date on which his or her application for a license is made. This division (B)(2)(f) shall not apply to applicants for manufacturers' licenses or to applicants that are corporations authorized to do business in this state.

(3) No license shall be issued to a partnership, limited partnership, limited liability company or corporation if:

(a) Each member of the partnership or each of the directors, principal officers, or managers does not qualify under division (B)(2)(a), (b), (c) and (e) of this section;

(b) It has had any license issued under this ordinance relating to the regulation the manufacture, sale, and transportation of alcoholic beverages revoked for cause or has been convicted of a violation of any such Kentucky Revised statute relating to the manufacture, sale and transportation of alcoholic beverages, until the expiration of two (2) years from the date of the revocation or conviction; or

(c) It is a partnership or corporation, if any member of the partnership or any director, manager or principal officer of the corporation has had any license issued under any statute relating to the regulation of the manufacture, sale, and transportation of alcoholic beverages, revoked for cause or has been convicted of a violation of any such Kentucky Revised statute relating to the manufacture, sale and transportation of alcoholic beverages, until the

expiration of the later of two (2) years from the date of the revocation or two (2) years from the date of conviction.

(4) The provisions of division (B)(2)(a) and (b) shall apply to anyone applying for a new license under this chapter after July 15, 1998, but shall not apply to those who renew a license that was originally issued prior to July 15, 1998, or an application for a supplemental license where the original license was issued prior to July 15, 1998.

(C) License fees and terms of licenses.

(1) Application fees. Upon submission of an original application or request for renewal, the applicant shall submit the stated fee listed below. Said fee shall be paid by cash, certified check, postal or express money order, or corporate check. Only the person or business entity making the application and no other person or business entity shall pay for any license issued under this chapter.

(2) Upon an application for a new license authorized under the Kentucky Revised Statutes and the City of Morehead Code of Ordinances, the applicant shall be charged, if the license is issued, the full fee listed below for the respective license if six (6) months or more remain before the license is due to be renewed and one-half (1/2) of the fee listed below if less than six (6) months remain before the license is due to be renewed. No abatement of license fees shall be permitted to any applicant who held a license for the same kind for the same premises in the preceding license period and who was actually doing business under the license during the last month of the preceding license period.

(3) The license fees shall be as follows:

(a)	Quota retail package license	\$630.00 or maximum allowed by law
(b)	Quota retail drink license	\$630.00 or maximum allowed by law
(c)	Nonquota (NQ) malt beverage package license	\$200.00 or maximum allowed by law
(d)	Nonquota type 2 (NQ2) retail drink license	\$630.00 or maximum allowed by law
(e)	Nonquota type 3 (NQ3) retail drink license	\$300.00 or maximum allowed by law
(f)	Nonquota type 4 (NQ4) retail malt beverage drink license	\$200.00 or maximum allowed by law
(g)	Sunday retail drink license	\$300.00 or maximum allowed by law
(h)	Special temporary license	\$50 or maximum allowed by law

(i)	Caterer's license	\$800.00 or maximum allowed by law
(j)	Microbrewery license	\$500.00 or maximum allowed by law
(k)	Supplemental bar license	\$630.00 or maximum allowed by law. This is the fee for each of the first five (5) supplemental bar licenses. There shall be no charge for each supplemental license issued in excess of five (5) to the same licensee at the same premises.
(l)	Special temporary distilled spirits and wine auction license	\$200.00 or maximum allowed by law
(m)	Distributor's license	\$400.00 or maximum allowed by law
(n)	Wholesaler's license	\$3,000.00 or the maximum allowed by law

(4) The holder of a nonquota retail malt beverage package license may obtain a nonquota type 4 malt beverage drink license for a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00). The holder of a nonquota type 4 malt beverage drink license may obtain a nonquota retail malt beverage package license for a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00).

(5) The license fee for special temporary licenses shall be waived for microbreweries and small farm wineries participating in festivals sponsored by the city. The entities shall hold all required licenses from the Commonwealth of Kentucky and be in good standing with the city.

(6) Expiration of license. All licenses, except special temporary licenses, issued under this chapter shall expire on June 30 of each year and the application/renewal fee shall be due and payable before July 1 of each year.

§ 113.05 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

All licenses granted hereunder shall be subject to the conditions of this chapter and the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

(A) License form. All city licenses issued under this chapter shall be printed so as to be readily distinguished from other licenses and in such form as may be prescribed by the Board of City Council and shall contain the following:

- (1) Name and address of the licensee;
- (2) Number of the license;
- (3) Type of license;
- (4) A description by street and number, or otherwise, of the licensed premises;
- (5) The name and address of the owner of the building in which the licensed premises are located;
- (6) The expiration of the license; and
- (7) A statement in substance that the license shall not be a property or vested right and that it may be revoked at any time pursuant to law.

(B) Posting of licenses.

(1) Before commencing or doing any business for the time for which a license has been issued, all licenses issued under this chapter shall be posted and at all times displayed in a conspicuous place in the room or principal room where the business is carried on, so that all persons visiting the place may readily see the license.

(2) No licensee shall post the license or permit to be posted, upon premises other than the licensee's premises or upon premises where traffic in alcoholic beverages is being carried on by any person other than the licensee, or knowingly deface, destroy or alter the license in any respect.

(C) All alcoholic beverage retailers shall have printed on the front window of the licensed premises the name of the licensee together with the inscription: "Kentucky Retail Package Liquor Licenses No....." in uniform letters not less than three (3) inches in height.

(D) Required warning displays.

(1) All licensed retail vendors of alcoholic beverages shall post in a prominent place easily seen by patrons a printed sign at least eleven (11) inches by fourteen (14) inches in size, with letters at least one (1) inch high, supplied by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, and with gender-neutral language supplied by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, which shall warn that drinking

§ 119.01 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

"MOBILE FOOD UNIT." Food establishment which is on wheels and which sells food and/or beverages.

"MOBILE FOOD UNIT VENDOR." A merchant who conducts business from a mobile food unit.

"MOBILE FOOD UNIT VENDOR LICENSE." A license which authorizes a person to conduct business from a mobile food unit. This license is in addition to the city's business license which is also required. (Ord. 01:2017, passed 1-9-17; Am. Ord. 23:2017, passed 7-27-17)

§ 119.02 LICENSING AND PERMIT REQUIRED.

(A) The licensing of a mobile food unit vendor shall be on a per unit basis, with each different mobile food unit vendor acquiring a separate license for each mobile food unit.

(B) Mobile food unit vendors shall be required to have a city occupational business license.

(C) All applications for Licenses shall be accompanied with the required certificate of general liability insurance, proof of Health Department approval, proof of a city business license and required fee. The annual license fee shall be two-hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00)

(D) Any person operating more than one (1) mobile food unit shall pay an additional twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee for each additional unit. This fee will not be prorated and will be in effect for the same period of time as the license for the primary mobile food unit.

(E) Vendors shall submit the license application and fee to the Code Enforcement Officer in the Building Inspector/City Planner's Department. Licenses are valid for twelve (12) months unless otherwise invalidated, revoked, or terminated prior to the end of the twelve (12) month term. Mobile food unit vendors must reapply and pay the fee each year.

(F) The mobile food unit vendor shall notify the Code Enforcement Officer when their location changes and provide any additional information requested for the new location.

(G) It shall be unlawful for any person to intentionally provide false information or to intentionally omit requested information on an application for any license pertaining to mobile food unit vendors.

(H) As a condition of issuance of any license, the mobile food unit vendor, agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the city and its officials, officers, employees, representatives, and agents against liability and/or loss arising from activities connected with and/or undertaken pursuant to the license. The city is not liable for any business loss, property loss, or other damage that may result from use of the license or suspension or revocation of the license, or the discontinuances of the practice of permitting such activity, and no such vendor shall maintain any claim or action against the City of Morehead and/or its officials, officers, employees, or agents on account of any suspension, revocation or discontinuance.

(I) If a mobile food unit vendor will be operating on private property, then said vendor shall provide a written authorization from the property owner or the business owner. Said authorization shall be presented to the Code Enforcement Officer at least ten (10) hours before use.

§ 119.03 GENERAL REGULATIONS OF MOBILE FOOD UNIT VENDORS AND MOBILE FOOD UNITS.

All mobile food unit vendors must comply with the following:

(A) Mobile food unit vendors shall be permitted to operate between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. No mobile food unit may be at any one (1) location for more than five (5) consecutive days.

(B) The requirements of all applicable city ordinances and regulations, including zoning, occupational tax and restaurant tax shall apply to said operations. Except, that the regulations regarding temporary structures, in Title 15 of the Code of Ordinances shall not apply to mobile food unit vendors, so long as said unit is not in one (1) place for more than five (5) consecutive days.

(C) The vendors shall at all times operate in a manner that ensures the safety of patrons, pedestrians and the public.

(D) Food trucks are permitted on private property only with written permission from the property owner which will be displayed with the occupational license, mobile food vending permit and Rowan County Health Department permit.

(E) The vendors shall only use lighting which is permanently or semipermanently affixed to their unit and which does not cause any glare that could be considered a public hazard, nuisance or distraction to vehicular movement, neighboring business operation or residential uses. No flashing or strobe lighting shall be permitted.

(F) The vendors shall not use any electrical outlets located within the public right of way or on public property, unless specifically authorized by the City of Morehead or if required, the utility company. A vendor shall not create any tripping or hazard related to its use of electricity.

(G) The vendor shall not block access to or use of any public utility pole or set up any chairs or tables on the public right-of-way.

(H) The vendor shall not in any manner damage public property of the public right-of-way. The vendors shall be solely responsible for any such damage.

(I) The vendor shall not locate or operate within an area closed or not accessible due to an emergency.

(J) Charitable/non-profit organizations may operate mobile food vendors without the necessity of a mobile food unit permit.

(K) No mobile food unit vendor shall sell or vend from his or her unit or within one hundred and fifty (150) feet of any restaurant, cafe, or eating establishment offering as a main featured item or items similar to that restaurant, cafe, or eating establishment at the time it is opened for business unless approval is obtained in writing from the owner of the business.

(L) Every mobile food unit vendor shall ensure that the interior, including the windows, shall be maintained in a clean and safe condition, free of grease, dirt, debris, or other trash.

(M) The exterior of the unit and surrounding area shall also be maintained in a clean, undamaged condition and present a favorable appearance including, but not limited to, the body of the vehicle, the paint, all glass, hubcaps(if installed), head and tail lights and grill and bumper. Additionally the exterior of the unit and surrounding area shall be free of grease, dirt, debris and any and all other trash.

§ 119.99 PENALTY.

(A) If the vendor of a mobile food unit does not move after five (5) days and the unit is on public property, the city will give a towing notice to the vendor by posting it on the mobile food unit. If the mobile food unit is not moved within twenty-four (24) hours from the time of the notice, the city will have the unit towed and the vendor will be required to pay all towing and storage fees before the mobile food unit is returned.

(B) For all other violations, the Code Enforcement Officer shall issue a notice of violation along with a towing notice. If said violation is not timely corrected, the city shall have the mobile food unit towed and the vendor will be required to pay all towing and storage fees before the mobile food unit is returned.
