Lesson Plans

The purpose of this field trip is to expose students to the cinematic experience of watching a live, dramatic production with a high level of acting and direction. This will allow students to witness production that reflects culture, history, and symbolism. Additionally students will see how culture is influenced by language, literature, arts, beliefs, and behaviors, and may result in unique perspective. Students will analyze and/or explain how diverse cultures and time periods can affect drama and theatre. This purpose fulfills Core Content Standards SS-07-2.1.1 and SS-07-5.1.1.

Prior to the trip we will be discussing theme and central ideas of a piece, and how these are conveyed through particular details. The students will be able to do the same with the theme of the play. We will also be working with the story and plot that unfolds, and how the characters respond as they reach a resolution. Upon returning from the play, students will discuss the performance and write a review of the play. This meets Common Core Standards RL. 7.2 and RL. 7.3.

Play description taken from Stage One website: Its alive! When Victor Frankenstein's experiments result in a grotesque creature beyond his control, chaos ensues. Frankenstein is determined to destroy his monstrous creation, but who is the real monster
