Better School Level Maintenance Structure

- School based maintenance staff supervised by Operations staff with expertise and knowledge in building maintenance
- Necessary Supplies and tools provided by the district, not the school's budget.



Fund maintenance based on the actual need

- Necessary repairs, replacements, and maintenance must be funded.
- Follow industry standards for the upkeep of our schools.



Energy Savings Investments

- New windows
- Geothermal heating and cooling
- Solar power



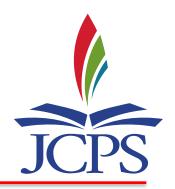
Standardized Security & Access Systems

Repurposing / Reduction of Campuses

Consolidation of Redundant Programs

All of JCPS's elementary students could be housed comfortably in 77 schools. We have 91.

There are several "central" offices that are costly to operate / renovate.

Programs such as TAPP were under-enrolled and in multiple locations

We have potentially several possibilities for this.

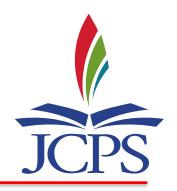

Central Office



We will recommend relocating central offices to one new modern, energy efficient location

Will seek a managed lease
Will need less current square footage
Fixed cost savings could cover much of lease
Could sell or repurpose VH campus

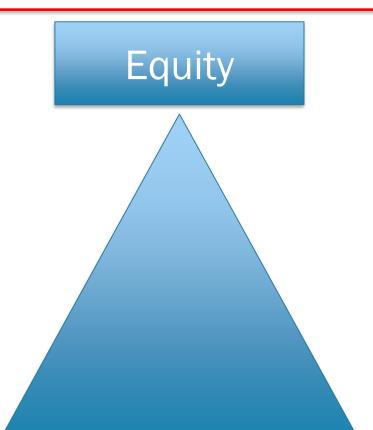
