MRA is up and running with a full house! Archery started up the first week of programming as well as Coding Club. MRA staff is grouping and assessing skills to plan lessons based on the needs to be targeted in each grade level. We have a great staff this year and teachers are already coming in the cafeteria to let us know if a particular student needs help with an assignment or skill. I think it's going to be a great year for MRA!

Teachers have begun a book study of *What Teachers Should Know and Be Able to Do* as a part of our participation in being a National Board Professional Learning Pilot School. Teachers will work through the five core propositions of: 1) Teachers are Committed to Students and Their Learning, 2) Teachers Know the Subjects They Teach and How to Teach Those Subjects to Students, 3) Teachers are Responsible for Managing and Monitoring Student Learning, 4) Teachers Think Systematically About Their Practice and Learn from Experience, and 5) Teachers are Members of Learning Communities.

Students in grades K-5 are engaged in literacy activities through Artful Reading. Striving Readers Cohort 1 teachers received training this summer for implementing these engaging units which incorporate literacy standards through the arts. These teachers are excited with the unit they have and are looking forward to receiving the next unit.

The first round of school-wide STAR testing has been completed and students worked very hard while testing. Teachers have already analyzed this data and created intervention groups accordingly.

Mr. Moneymaker held an informational meeting on August 27th for 4th & 5th grade families interested in going to Washington, D.C. in June 2019. There were several families in attendance. Mr. Moneymaker will visit NLES to provide information to any who are interested in attending from there, and an invitation has been extended to LCMS, too.

Students with great behavior in the first few weeks of school attended the first PBIS Celebration on August 31st. Students were treated to Jungle Juice and Animal Crackers and allowed some Jungle Gym Time.
