### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

As per Board policy all requests to submit and receive grants must be approved by Board of Education.

The Woodford County Community Fund, in partnership with the Joe and Debbie Graviss Foundation, Glenn and Sandi Bromagen, and the Quigg Fund will award grants to support ideas arising from the inaugural On the Table conversations in Woodford County. Successful proposals will address community needs through projects and programs that demonstrate sustainable impact and measurable outcomes. Following an initial review by the Woodford County Community Fund, the community will be invited to weigh-in and help select the final grant recipients. In October, Woodford County residents will vote on the proposals to receive funding. Grant awards will be between \$2,500 and \$10,000; up to \$25,000 in potential grants may be awarded.

#### **SUMMARY OF MAJOR ELEMENTS:**

Permission to request and receive if awarded grant(s): Woodford Community Fund is awarding grants between \$2,500 and \$25,000 forcommunity development projects in Woodford County. The activities of the community activism class at WCHS fit the criteria for this grant and the money if awarded would help the class with its yearly community development events. These include the pop-up "Activate: Inspire Community" events that have taken the place of the Spark events of past years. The class is currently developing events that celebrate the unique cultures that bind Woodford County together. The goal is to bring people together in a single event or series of events that would allow our community to experience the diversity that sometimes is hidden in our county. This money would go a long way to helping the class create a special event that has the potential to further build community in our county.



# ON THE TABLE GRANT OPPORTUNITY

The Woodford County Community Fund, in partnership with the Joe and Debbie Graviss Foundation, Glenn and Sandi Bromagen, and the Quigg Fund will award grants to support ideas arising from the inaugural **On the Table** conversations in Woodford County. Successful proposals will address community needs through projects and programs that demonstrate sustainable impact and measurable outcomes. Following an initial review by the Woodford County Community Fund, the community will be invited to weigh-in and help select the final grant recipients. ### Eligibility

- Tax-exempt charitable 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations, schools, and government agencies
- Individuals or for-profit entities that have established a partnership with a qualifying tax-exempt organization, school, or government agency that will serve as fiscal sponsor for this grant application\*
- Applicant organization must be located in or serve residents of Woodford County

#### \*Fiscal Sponsorship

- Generally, organizations eligible to receive grants from Woodford County Community Fund are those determined by the IRS to be public charities. However, the Advisory Board is aware that there may be worthwhile projects proposed by applicants or organizations that do not have this status. Therefore, any applicant that is not a tax-exempt charitable 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, school, or government agency, may apply if they have established a partnership with a qualifying tax-exempt organization, school, or government agency that will serve as fiscal sponsor for this grant application
- The fiscal sponsor is responsible for receiving, distributing, tracking, and maintaining control over grant funds
- The fiscal sponsor is responsible for all required grant reporting

Proposals will be evaluated for presentation to the community in the context of the following criteria:

- Project Specifics: Does the proposal answer the following questions?
  - -What exactly does the applicant propose to achieve?
  - -How?
  - -With Whom?
  - -Why is achieving this important?
  - -What difference will it make?
- Measurable Outcomes Does the proposal clearly identify specific goals for the project and a deliberate plan for evaluating them?
- Attainability Given the context of the proposed project, are goals realistic and achievable?
- Relevancy- Does the project address an issue identified by On The Table Participants?
- **Sustainability** Will the project have a lasting impact on the community? Will it be sustainable beyond the initial investment made by the Woodford County Community Fund?
- Capacity Does applicant demonstrate ability to successfully accomplish the proposed activities?
- **Budget** Is the project budget detailed and clearly stated?
- Timeline Can the project be completed in 24 months?
