## Newport Independent Schools DPP AND STUDENT SERVICES REPORT 9/26/2018

Madame Chair, ladies and gentlemen of the board. Excellent news continues in the Newport Independent School District. As usual, I want to compliment all of our service contributors for the outstanding job they continue to do for our students and families. As customary, there are many substantial services and events that are occurring that I am happy to relate. They are as follows:

- ✓ NSTEP (Newport Service, Tools and Empowerment Project) Coordinator, Kristy McNally:
  - 52 new residence/affidavit checks
  - Diversity Wildcats (after school programming for students exp. housing instability) at both NPS and NIS
  - Stock the Kitchen-now offering access to Infinite Campus so parents can access their students grades/attendance/behavior
  - Stock the Kitchen serving +/- 350 individuals a month
  - Parent Support Group-starts in conjunction with Bornlearning Oct. 16
  - Attending new teacher meetings to learn more about Kagan/Growth Mindset to make sure it is incorporated in Diversity Wildcats

- ✓ Newport Primary FRC Coordinator, Molly Wesley reports:
  - As of September 20, 2018, the following were distributed to students:
    - 2 clothing vouchers (\$30 at Burlington Coat Factory or the K-Mart in Edgewood). <u>Riverfront Kiwanis has budgeted the</u> <u>NPS/FRC with \$2,000 to use in vouchers during the 2018-2019</u> school year.
    - 134 items of clothing from the FRC clothing closet (many thanks to all of the individuals who donate their gently used clothing and shoes to the FRC)
    - 1 referrals have been made to the Care Closet for clothing, and 2 bags of clothing have been delivered for students referred last month
    - 1 voucher has been issued to a NPS student for eyeglasses at Lens Crafters
    - 4 backpacks
  - August 22 Samaritan's Feet came to NPS to wash students' feet, and to measure every student for a new pair of shoes, and send them home

with a new pair of shoes! Many community partners were also involved in making this happen!

- September 4 Molly (and school staff, Stacey Wells) attended a Safety Meeting at the Cabinet for Health and Family Services regarding a NPS student who has been removed from her parent's custody and placed with a family member while the Cabinet investigates.
- September 4 Girl Scout volunteer recruitment night was held at NPS, and 12 families attended, who are interested in being more involved with the Girl Scouts
- September 6 Newport hosted the Region 4 FRYSC Coordinator's meeting at the main training room at the Welcome Center
- September 10 Molly (and Shirley) attended an event at Corpus Christi Apartments to meet the NKU President, Ashish Vaidya.
- September 11 All Newport families approximately 60 adults and approximately 80 children - who have EL students (English Language Learners) were invited to attend a meeting at NPS. Molly and Amber provided pizza and water for dinner, and Skool Aid activities to entertain the children during the meeting. In addition, community partners came to present information about programs the families may be interested in for themselves and/or their children: Brighton Center HIPPY, Boys & Girls Club, 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Center, Bornlearning Academy, and BB&T Bank on Monmouth Street.
- September 14 Molly and Amber sat at a table during the Brighton Center's annual Community Celebration to promote the Bornlearning Academy.
- September 18 Adopt a Class building Coordinators and team leads attended the annual Symposium and breakfast at Xavier University

- Lunch Buddies (Big Brother Big Sister, school-based mentoring) have begun spending 45-minutes together at lunchtime each week, and applications have gone home with students who may be matched with a Lunch Buddy. Three Lunch Buddy matches are continuing at NPS from last school year.
- 15 students are walking to the Boys & Girls Club after school with B&G Club staff.
- NPS students are able to receive mental health therapy on-site through Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health, MEBS & Associates, North Key, and our school counselor. Many students also see outside agencies (i.e., Holly Hill) for therapy.
- Students at NP continue to be encouraged to recycle items at school, and to continue to collect plastic lids to recycle into additional "Buddy Benches" and/or other furniture for the school.

  - Club Update: All 21st Century Afterschool Clubs begin 8/27/18.
  - 200+ NHS students registered in an after school clubs, 8<sup>th-</sup> 12thth grade
  - <u>NHS Club of the Month</u>: The Equine Club, also known as, "Horse Club" is run by the Campbell County Extension Office. Members meet once a week on Wednesdays. Don and Claire, 4H representative educate students on what it takes to own and care for a horse. Each week that students meet, they discuss types or horses, and all the different farms that raise horses here in Northern Kentucky. Every other week the club heads out to a different farm and students get hands on experience working with the owners and the horses. This opportunity is uniquely special for our inner city children to experience. They get the chance to learn about other ways of living, as well as what it takes to care for horses.

- o 2018-2019 Fall Programming began on Wednesday September 5<sup>th</sup>
- Newport Primary- currently 133 students are participating in early morning/after school programming
- Newport Intermediate- currently 137 students are participating in afterschool programming, an additional 60+ students participate in the Morning Program at NIS
- Newport NHS- 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> grade approximately 25 students are participating in activities
- Club highlight: The Fishing Club had 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students from NIS unplugged from technology and enjoying a beautiful afternoon fishing on Thursday, September 16, 2018. Adam Wise, Nate Green, and Kimberly Ward took selected students on a fishing field trip to Southgate Community Center fishing lake. This was the first time fishing for many of our students! NHS student volunteers showed our younger students how to bait hooks, cast and reel in fish. Fishing teaches our children how to appreciate the outdoors, learn patience and perseverance! The Fishing Club will meet 1-2 times per month, weather permitting.



✓ Newport Independent School District Health Services (School Nurses):

- Mrs. Kim Weaver, RN, BSN and School Health Coordinator (Newport Primary School & Newport Intermediate School) Reports:
  - 160 Nurse visits at NPS & four students for daily medication
  - 343 Nurse visits at NIS & eleven students for daily medication & one daily medical procedure

- One student at the Primary requires a daily medical procedure and 8 students require daily medication.
- Both nurses are notifying families of required health records that are needed and assisting in scheduling school physicals.
- Mrs. Kim Weaver also reports:

  - 85 students at NPS, 88 at NIS and 116 at NHS are out of compliance with vaccines. Phone calls have been made to parents and guardians, letters have been mailed and appointments will be scheduled with Nurse Practitioner when vaccines arrive.

  - Autism training scheduled for PD day in September by Children's Hospital Team

✓ You now have the first month of attendance and it is good. While we are down 20 students and our attendance rate is up 1.44% from this time last year, I don't worry much at this moment. Nevertheless, I want to commend Dr. Orman and her team. It is the highest first month for the high school in almost ten years! Obviously, we need to continue the push to attain our goal of a 95% attendance rate for our district. Throughout the district we are changing the climate of expectations and as we do so we will see that increase in student attendance.
