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PLTW Computer Science

Evidence shows there is a large workforce demand for individuals with STEM-based education and skills, as well as individuals with strong problem-solving, perseverance, critical-thinking and collaboration skills. It is essential that students across all grade levels are giving opportunities to develop those skills, and that teachers receive the training and support needed to help develop those skills in their students.

The Toyota USA Foundation has partnered with PLTW to help improve the teaching and learning of science, technology, engineering and mathematics in order to help address these workforce demands. Eligibility Requirements:

PLTW Program: PLTW Computer Science

Program Requirements: Schools may use funds to offset the cost of implementing PLTW Computer Science courses starting in the 2019-2020 academic year. Grant awarded schools must offer at least one PLTW Computer Science course of their choosing for the 2019-2020 academic year and at least three by the 2021-2022 academic year.

School Type: Public, Charter

Geographic Area: Public schools within a 50 mile radius of Toyota facilities in the following communities are eligible for award consideration:

• Alabama: Huntsville • Indiana: Princeton • Kentucky: Georgetown

• Missouri: Troy

• Mississippi: Blue Springs

• Tennessee: Jackson

• Texas: Plano and San Antonio

• West Virginia: Buffalo

Other: Preference will be given to applicants who make clear that their request is part of a larger effort to buildout PreK-12 PLTW pathways across their district.

Woodford County Schools is passionate about ensuring we are working collaboratively with our community, teachers, and students to ensure that our graduates are prepared to meet the work-force needs of our community as a whole. As our community continues to grow Woodford County Schools has recognized that a large number of jobs in the Central Kentucky community are becoming available in the areas of engineering and manufacturing. As part of this recognition that our school system must advance and adjust to ensure our graduates are prepared to fill these positions the school board has allocated funds in a "STEM" account to meet these needs. Knowing that the start-up costs to create a top-level engineering and manufacturing program are significant Woodford County Schools has pledged a minimum of \$15,000 in FY17, \$10,000 in FY18, and \$5,000 in subsequent years to directly support the purchase of equipment, materials, and curriculums to move our manufacturing and engineering departments forward so that our graduates can meet the work-force needs of Central Kentucky. Woodford County Schools invests in the teachers and their professionalism and believes that decisions are best made at the closest point to student impact and thus these funds are flexible based upon the needs seen by the teachers within the programs.
