Learning Targets: I can identify story elements (characters, setting, and key details) in a text. I can retell a story (B, M, E). I can tell what I like or dislike about a story or play.

Activities Before: Students will read and discuss Junie B. Jones, Jingle Bells, Batman Smells. Students will be discussing characters, setting, and key details. Students will practice retelling the stories. Students will learn about proper audience etiquette.

Activities After: Students will discuss similarities and differences between the book and the play. Students will write/draw about which they prefer: reading the story or seeing the story performed on stage and explain why. We will share these as a whole group.

Enrichment/Enhancement: Attending a play in person will enhance the student learning and afford the student a cultural opportunity that he or she may not have without the classroom teacher providing this opportunity. Seeing actors in person is a valuable experience that all students should have.

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
