- The lock project is moving forward.
 - Over Fall Break, I did a walk through of the district with Assa Abloy. We looked at every interior door (classrooms, offices, closets, etc) and all exterior doors. The options for each door was marked on the floor plans.
 - Bill Weimer from Assa Abloy Door Security Solutions met with Brad Beatt with Clotfelter-Samokar Architects on October 12th. They met to discuss the products and how the installation will be integrated into the facilities plan. We have sent drawings to the buildings to Mr. Weimer so that he can begin the system design specific to our district. Once this is completed, we will have a more specific cost.
- ERate - We have been approved for \$31, 475.96, so far, for the Upper Elementary and Middle School network upgraded. We still have three applications that are pending that total \$45,110.93. I expect these applications to be approved within the next 30 days. The network upgrade to the largest building in our district will cost approximately \$100,000. With ERate funds covering the majority of this project, we will use KETS money to pay the remaining costs.
- Nucor Funding - I am in conversation with the company regarding project details and the timeline. They would like to meet to discuss the goals of the project and for district personnel to tour the mill. I will be in contact with the board when we have a tour date.
