Re: High School Requirements

Attached is a copy of high school requirements compared to current requirements.

A few items to note:

- 1. Change in course work starting 2020-21 financial literacy course must be a part of graduation.
- 2. Starting 2020-21 all sophomores will take a basic competency test in math and reading. Students must pass the exams to graduate.
- 3. Every student (no exemptions) must be college or career ready to graduate. This requirement starts in the Fall of 2019.

Number 3 has always counted in our transition data, but not a requirement to graduate. Students must reach the benchmarks on ACT test.
