November Updates:

- Mr. Arnold attended:
  - Certified Evaluation Training--Learned how to objectively observe teachers using the Danielson Framework.
  - ARC Chair Training--Learned the basics of Special Ed law and how to lead an ARC meeting.
  - Leader In Me Training--Learned about how the 7 Habits can change how you view the world and how students can be lead through them to make lasting change.
- Our new teachers attended a training on Questioning and Discussion lead by several high school teachers.
- Mrs. Webster attended:
  - "I attended a PD opportunity in Lexington at the Kentucky Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance Convention. This PD gave me the opportunity to hear from state leaders in health and physical education about the new drafted standards that have been approved by committee and are awaiting the last steps of approval. It also allowed me to meet and interact with other professionals in other districts around the state to get ideas for classroom activities and engagement.
