6. ORDINANCES - 2nd READING

6.A. Ordinance 21-2018 entitled ΑN ORDINANCE **ESTABLISHING** AN **ENTERTAINMENT** DESTINATION CENTER IN THE DOWNTOWN OF OWENSBORO; AND FURTHER DIRECTING THE CITY OF OWENSBORO TO APPLY FOR AN ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTER LICENSE FROM THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL; AND FURTHER ESTABLISHING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSEE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE COMMON AREAS ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTER, was approved 4-1 upon motion of Mayor Watson with a second by Commissioner Smith-Wright; Mayor Pro Tem Glenn voted nav.

KRS 243.030(21) authorizes the issuance of an Entertainment Destination Center (EDC) License by the Kentucky Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. The City seeks to create an EDC within its downtown for which it shall obtain a license from the Kentucky Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. The City further seeks to establish the requirements for a licensee to sell alcoholic beverages within the common areas of the EDC. City Manager Pagan explained that the various religious institutions within the boundary, Smothers Park playground and Shelton Memorial would be excluded from the EDC. A review process will take place for each event and the events will be limited to a specific time and specific place. The City can decide whether to approve or deny an event. Andy Gamblin (2920 Yale Place), Amanda Tann (3127 Dade Cove) and Josh Cook (Hawthorne Drive) spoke against the Ordinance. Dr. Fred Reeves (3520 Ashlawn Drive) explained the EDC was the top issue of the OBKY project. The prospective events will be highly regulated; time and place specific, with a rigorous application process and the event producer must provide security for the event. Mayor Watson added that if there are issues, it could be addressed in the future.

6.B. Ordinance 22-2018 entitled AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2019, AND AMENDING ORDINANCE 9-2018 TO RECEIVE DONATIONS FOR DOG PARK AND SETUP THE DOG PARK PROJECT; AND TO RECEIVE TRANSIT GRANT FUNDS, SETUP THE RELATED TRANSIT PROJECTS AND REDUCE GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO TRANSIT, ACCORDINGLY; AND TO TRANSFER FUNDS FROM CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS FUND TO INTERNATIONAL BLUEGRASS MUSIC CENTER FUND PER AGREEMENT, was approved 5-0 upon motion of Commissioner Smith-Wright with a second by Mayor Pro Tem Glenn.

Budget amendment to receive donations for dog park and setup the dog park project; and to receive Transit grant funds, setup the related Transit projects and reduce General Fund transfer to Transit, accordingly; and to transfer funds from Capital Improvements Fund to International Bluegrass Music Center (IBMC) Fund per agreement.
