- a. Academic Committee Minutes: Council reviewed two sets of minutes provided by committee chair, Dan Corley. The Academic Committee had approved the following changes to the course guide: (1) Adding Dual Credit Physics, (2) AP Chemistry was approved to replace Dual Credit Chemistry, (3) Adding Child Development Services I & II, (4) DC AGR 100--Animal Science, DC AGR 130--Agricultural Economics, DC AGR 160--Horticultural Science will be offered through Murray State Racer Academy, (5) AP Gov students will no longer be required to take Political Science B. The following rotations were approved: Psychology and Modern US History will replace Sociology and Holocaust, Ag Sales will replace Ag Communications, Parenting will replace Relationships, and Business Law will replace Business Management. **ORDER 18-33--** Brian Walters made a motion to accept the changes to the course guide. Mackenzie Heuer seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- b. Learning Environment Committee: Council reviewed two sets of minutes provided by committee chair, Aaron Howell. The Learning Environment Committee had approved the following change to the dress code effective beginning of school year 2019:

Clothing, jewelry, and accessories that bear the following:

- *Decorated with offensive illustrations*
- *Slogans that are suggestive of drugs, tobacco products, alcohol, sex, obscenities*
- *Language that proves to be a disturbing influence*
- *Statements, slogans, images or insignia that harass, threaten, intimidate, demean, suggest violence, or sexual innuendo*
- *And creates a reasonable risk of substantial influence of the educational process, i.e. The Confederate Flag, Swastikas, etc. or other clothing deemed intolerant based upon Federal Title IX guidelines, is not permitted.*

ORDER 18-34-- Angela Cannon made a motion to accept the dress code changes. Sherry Powers seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

c. Planning Committee Minutes: Council reviewed minutes provided by committee chair, Chastity Yates.
