

# Henderson County Schools Sesquicentennial Celebration 1869-2019

<u>1869, March 15th</u> The Henderson High School was incorporated, and on the same day an act to organize and establish a system of public schools in Henderson was passed.

"This magnificent institution has proven a great blessing to the youth of the city and the county. Its educational advantages are of the highest order and terms very reasonable. In Fact, so much so no young man or woman need go without a first-class education. There are two competent teachers employed, a principal and assistant, under the supervision and control of the Superintendent of the public schools,"

<u>1869, June 1st</u> An act was passed incorporating the Henderson Public School and authorizing by majority vote of the citizens the issue of a fifty thousand dollar city bond for the purpose of erecting a suitable building for school purpose. The Board of trustees was established.
