The focus of this month's work has been on analyzing Exceptional Children Transient Rates, Exceptional Children December 1st Child Count Data, and Results from Due Process Record Review Audit

Exceptional Children Transient Rates

Percent of Exceptional Children Population enrolled to or withdrew from the district during the 2018-19 school year. As of January 8, 2019 there have been 105 student incidents (student's identified with special needs transferred in or left the district).

• Transient Rate: 44%

Exceptional Children December 1st Child Count Results (Dec. 1, 2018)

- 235 Students are identified as having a disability
- Students identified with a disability account for 16% of total student enrollment
