SHARED Learning Basics

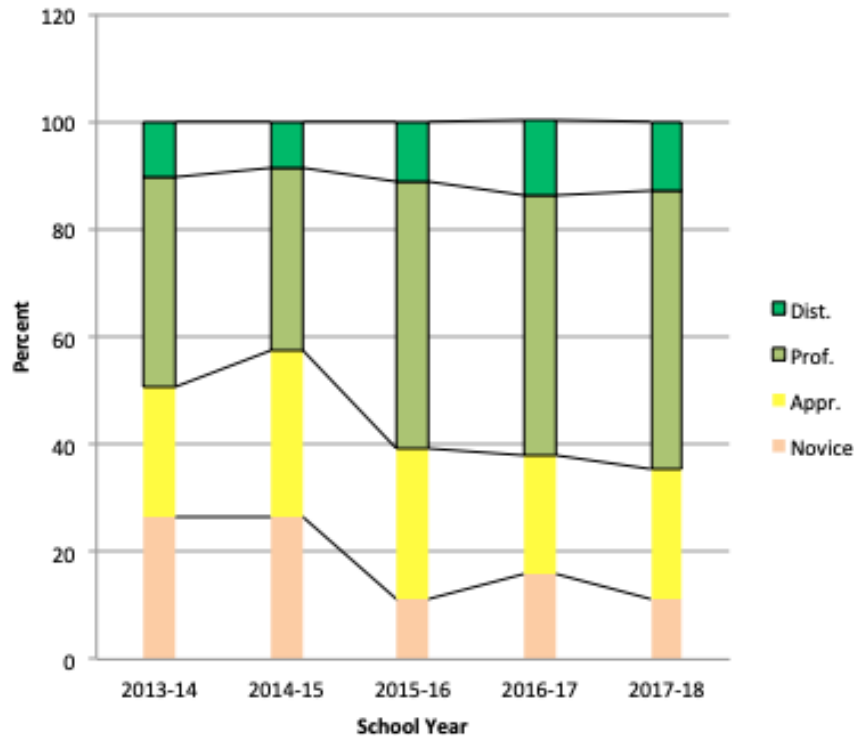
- 1) All students who struggle (reading or math) flexibly placed in the same room at the same time, regardless of IEP status
- 2) All special education staff (certified and classified) assigned to SHARED learning classrooms - two or three adults in each classroom during reading and math
- 3) Teaching occurs in one of two models:
 - Station Teaching
 - Chunking
- 4) Full commitment from teachers and administrators is key

SHARED Learning Results

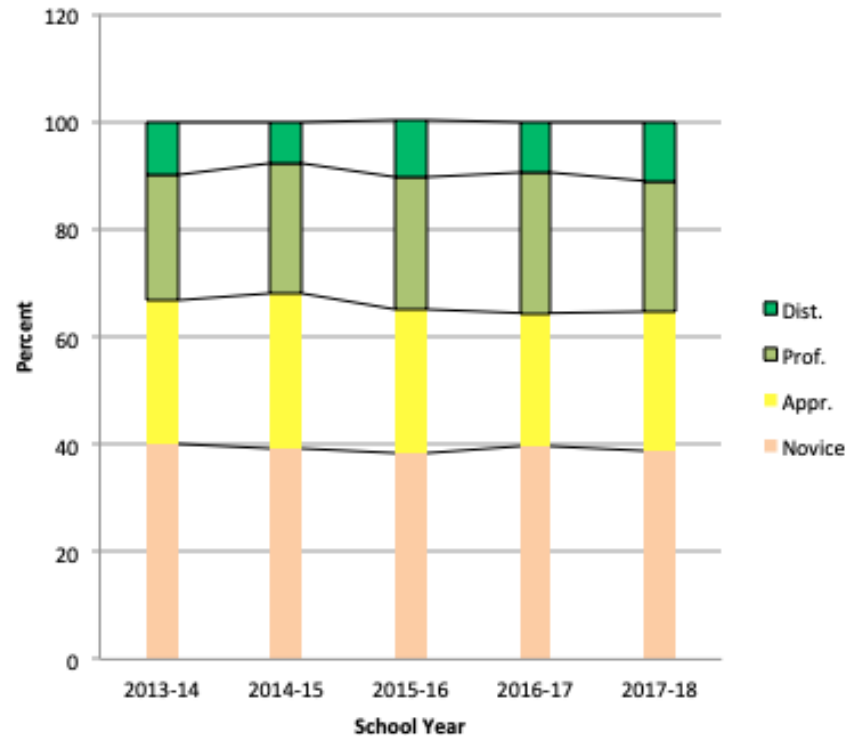
- Engagement is eliminated as a variable, leading to higher levels of learning and lower levels of classroom disruption
- Content and skills are taught in intentionally planned chunks that can be quickly assessed in real-time
- Students who struggle receive small group instruction in reading and math all day, every day
- Staff talent is maximized (special education teachers, level 1 and 2 IAs)
- All data reflects decreased percentages of novice and increased percentages of P/D (MAP, KPREP, DRA, ACT, etc.)

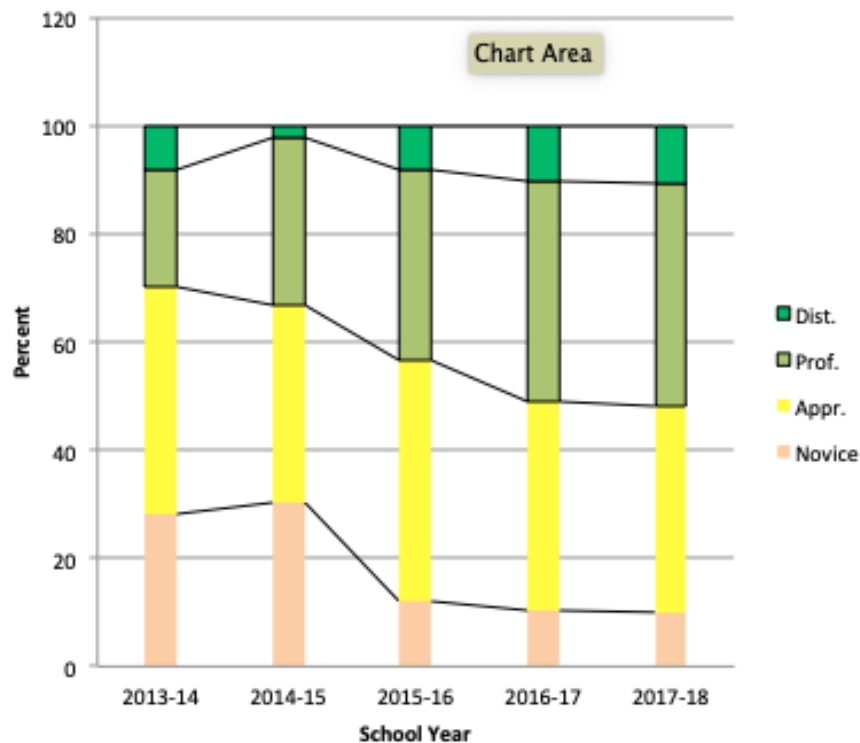


Elementary Reading - State

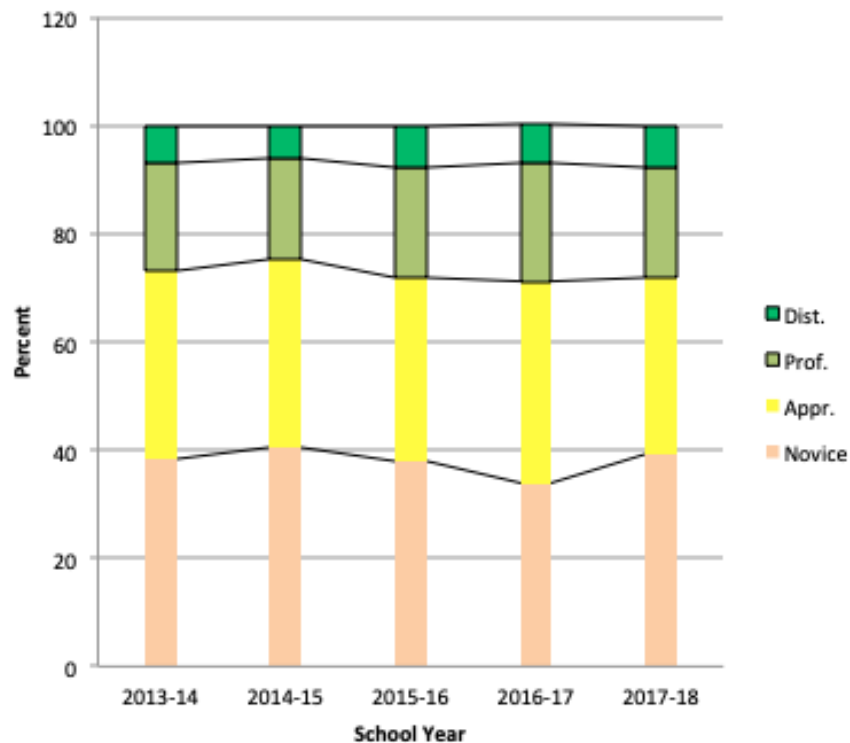

Elementary Math - Boyle

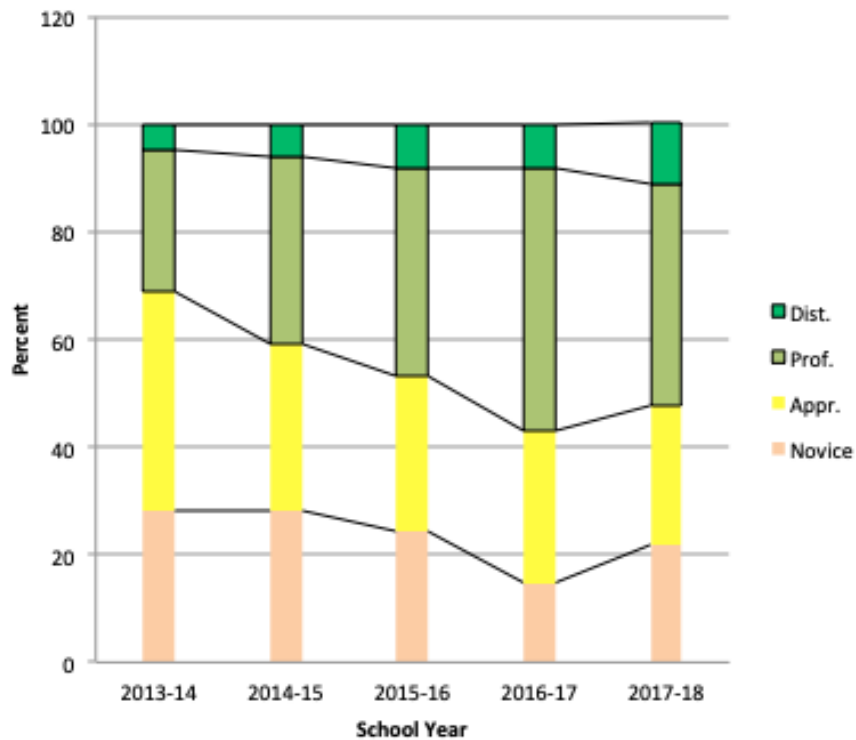


Elementary Math - State

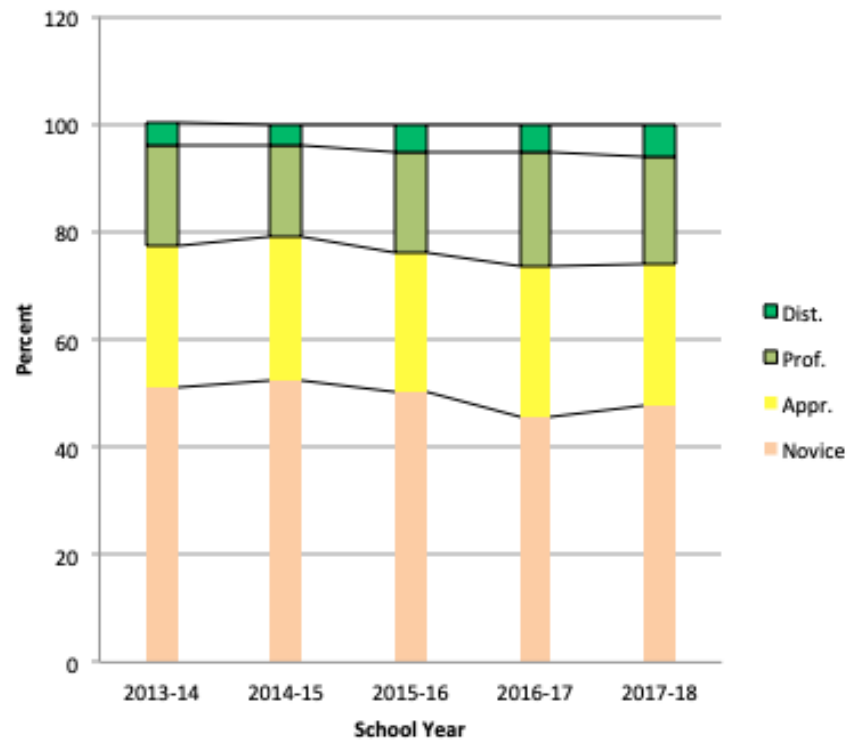

Middle Sch. Reading - Boyle

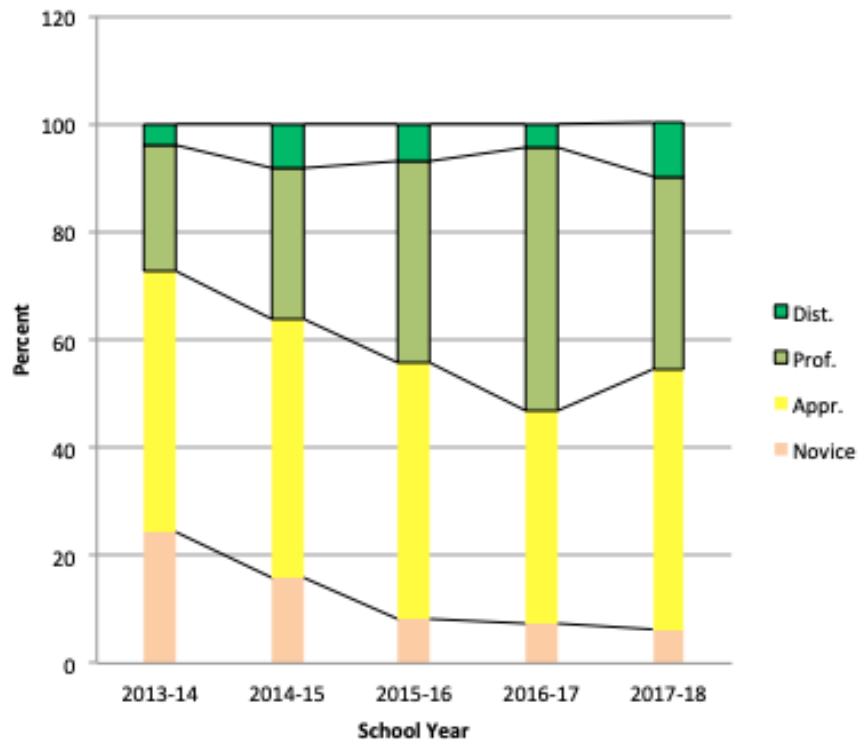


Middle Sch. Reading - State

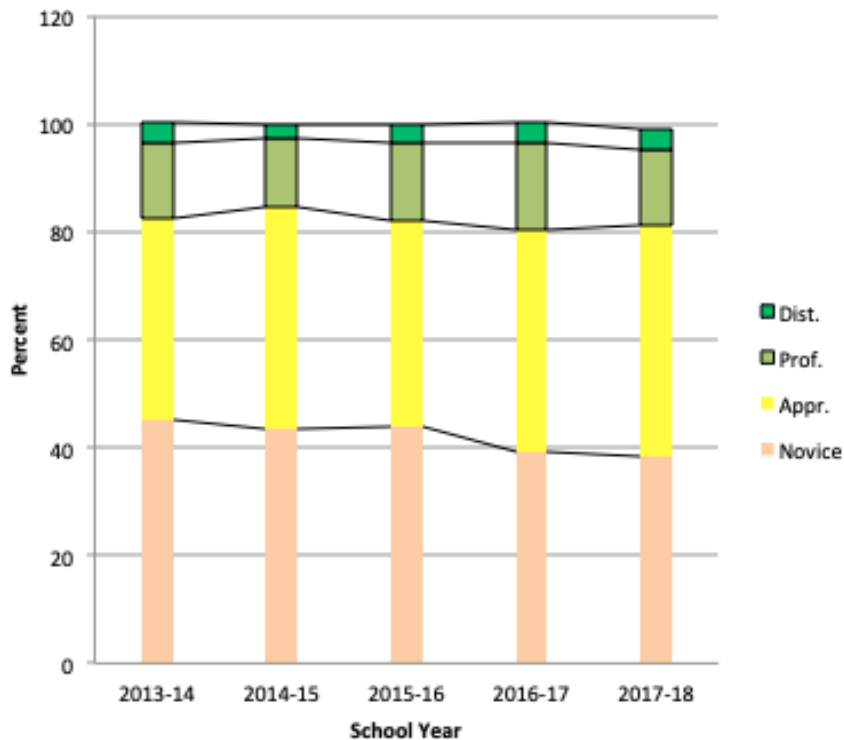

Administration's Role In SHARED Learning

How do we personalize learning to best meet the needs of each student and give them opportunities to find success?

Creating a Schedule and Planning

- All scheduling begins with our IEP students (priority)
- Creating a common planning
- Homogeneous grouping for reading and math, students are placed in groups based on performance level not label
- Heterogeneous grouping is achieved in a variety of ways at other times during the school day
- All teachers must honor the schedule

Building the Relationships and Laying the Foundations

- Pairing classroom teachers with special education teachers
- Using teachers' strengths to create content specialists that provide best learning environment
- Connectedness- Creating multiple connections with a student population that can often feel disconnected

Teachers' Role In SHARED Learning

SHARED Learning Essentials

- SHARED everything
- Rooted in the standards
- Daily data

SHARED Learning means SHARED everything

- Shared responsibility of the classroom and every student
- Both the regular education teacher and the special education teacher are responsible for planning, grading, contacting parents and all student data

Rooted in the Standards

- Common high expectations for all students
- Teachers become content experts through deconstructing the standards and developing district wide assessments
- All standards and assessment work quality controlled by school and district administration for congruence
- Differentiation happens in the process, not the product

Daily Data

- Both teachers collect and reflect upon data daily/ weekly
- Examples include exit slips, flashbacks, summative assessments, running records, DRA
- Data drives flexible student groupings

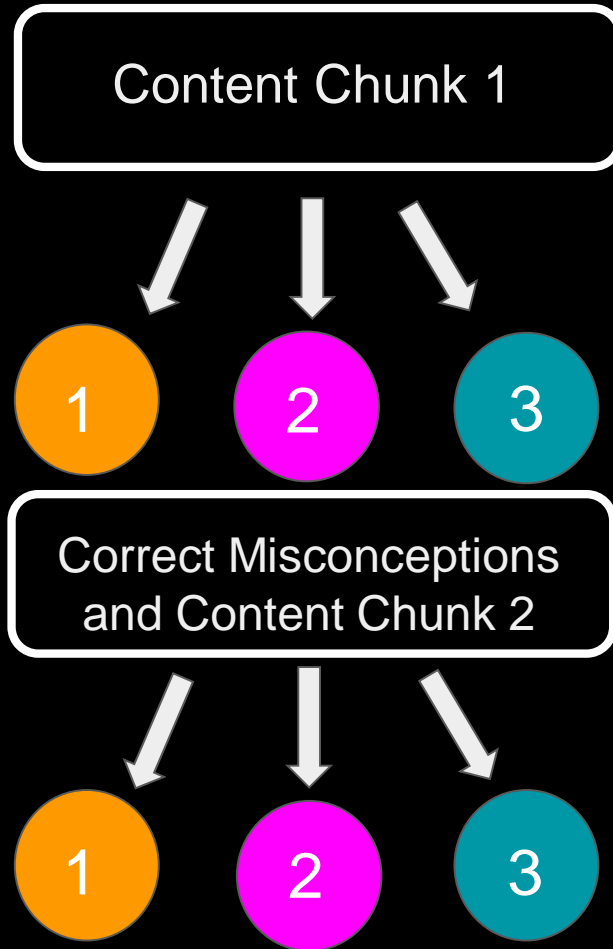
