Data Summary – December 31, 2018

Restorative Practices Schools

- 5/5 Elementary schools in year 1 of implementation saw a decrease in suspensions
- 4/5 Elementary schools in year 2 of implementation saw a decrease in suspensions
- Middle school suspension days are down 76%
- High school suspension days are down 74%
- Alternative school suspension events are down 33%
- Alternative school suspension days are down 57%

Looking Ahead

- Continue to scale at the rate of 10 schools a year
- Continue to offer consultation days provided by JCPS resource teachers to schools in first 2 years of implementation
- Add 2 MTSS Behavior resource teachers to support schools in implementation
- Continue to utilize the International Institute for Restorative Practices to build capacity in increasing the number of JCPS trainers
