Case 21 Assessment

Grades 3—8 have administered the Case 21 Benchmark assessments in Reading and Math to evaluate student mastery on grade level standards. Results were received last week and teachers are beginning to analyze the data to determine instructional implications.

Grades 9 and 10 took the Case 21 Ready assessment which is similar to the ACT. We have not yet received the results.

Case 21 is providing a more in-depth data analysis training for principals and instructional supervisors on Feb. 21.

Social-Emotional Curriculum


During March, the district will begin development of the SEL Curriculum. Teacher representatives and school counselors will work together to identify resources and activities to address the five SEL Competencies (Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills and Responsible Decision-Making). This curriculum will incorporate current initiatives that schools are doing and provide a method of identifying gaps to address. Staff will receive training in trauma-informed care and the SEL curriculum over the summer for implementation in 2019-20.
