Action/Discussion Item: Approve the agreement between Mountain Comprehensive Care Center (MCCC) and the Floyd County Schools for the provision of school-based therapy services during the 2019-20 school year.

Applicable Statutes or Regulations: KRS 158.440 and 160.290

Background and major Policy Implications: In the past, mental health services to students may have been limited due to difficulties that families experience with transporting children to appointments at MCCC. Students who had transportation and for whom appointments were scheduled during the school day were absent from school for a day or a portion thereof.

Providing therapy services on-site address both issues. Availability of MCCC staff members has also increased awareness of services available to students (and family members) that may have a need for mental health services. The number of sites served is directly related to availability of qualified MCCC therapist.

Fiscal Budgetary Impact: There will be no direct cost to Floyd County Schools associated with this agreement. Therapeutic services will be billed to each child's medical card, insurance, or to any grant monies available at MCCC. Therapists are provided a room in which to work at each school served.

Alternatives: None proposed

Recommended Action: Approval of the Memorandum of Agreement between the Floyd County Board of Education and Mountain Comprehensive Care for School-based therapy during the 2019-20 school year.

January 2019 - July 2019 SCHOOL BASED THERAPY SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN MOUNTAIN COMPREHENSIVE CARE CENTER AND THE FLOYD COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

WHEREAS, the Floyd County Board of Education, (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), realizes that there are children and adolescents who will perform better academically and function better socially at school if counseling services are accessible and available on-site,

WHEREAS, the Board has a strong interest in assuring the success of each student in their charge,

WHEREAS, Mountain Comprehensive Care Center (hereinafter referred to as "MCCC"), has a strong interest in, and capability of providing the clinical treatment and therapeutic support to those children in the Floyd County school system who have need of such services,

IT IS HEREBY AGREED, BY AND BETWEEN THE BOARD AND MCCC:

- A) The Parties will join in a fully collaborative effort to provide behavioral health services to children in the Floyd County school system through school based services. Specific schools will be identified by mutual agreement based on the
 - expressed need and desire for such services by the school administrator,
 - availability of space and facilities for such services at that school,
 - ongoing availability of qualified mental health personnel to provide those services.
- B) A mental health associate will be on-site at the assigned school as scheduled (per the School-Based Protocol, attached) except on days when there is no school. A community support associate, case manager, peer support specialist and staff from the Juvenile Intervention Services Program ("supports") will be on-site as needed.
- C) The mental health associate and supports will abide by all policies and procedures as established by the Board and each individual school as well as the policies of Mountain Comprehensive Care Center.
- D) An initial meeting will be set up between each school principal, the mental health associate, supports, the school counselor, and the Family Resource Center or Youth Service Center Director to discuss a protocol for communication and referral and to set aside space and identify facilities (e.g., phone access) necessary for behavioral health counseling.

E) The Board Will Provide:

 Administrative encouragement, support and flexibility to those schools and Family Resource Centers who are participating in the School-Based Counseling and support services including space donated for purposes of behavioral health contacts at the school.

F) MCCC Will Provide:

 Administrative and clinical supervision, a qualified mental health associate, a community support associate, a case manager, a peer support specialist and an individual from Juvenile Intervention Services Program; and any necessary clinical materials, as agreed to in the protocol.

Behavioral health services will be billed according to MCCC agency contracts with Medicaid and the Kentucky Department of Behavioral Health. Each individual child will be billed on a fee-for-service basis using third-party payors and/or an income-based sliding fee scale as applicable. The Board will not be billed by MCCC for these school-based services.

Psychological testing is not included in this service array.

All medical records will be maintained at the Floyd County MCCC Outpatient Clinic and are the property of MCCC. Access to the medical record by the school can only be made available through a release signed by each child's guardian or a court order.

It is understood that behavioral health services offered at the school may extend into the summer months when school is out of session only as agreed upon by the school administrator and MCCC with Family Resource/Youth Service Center support.

This contract may be terminated with or without cause with two weeks written notice by either party via certified mail.
