

Board Report for 3/27/2019

- As of 3/22/2019 – 44 seniors (85%) have received 102 acceptance letters to 20 different colleges/universities.
- As of 3/22/2019 – 8 seniors have received \$535,006 in scholarship offers.
- On March 6th, senior Austin Klosterman was celebrated as Dayton High School's recipient of DAR's Good Citizen Award. This award is given to students whom demonstrate leadership, good citizenship, dependability, and patriotism both inside and outside the classroom. He was honored at a luncheon hosted by our local Mary Ingles Chapter at Highland Country Club.
- On March 6th, in collaboration with the Central Office, attendance letters were sent home with all students in grades 7-12. Letters were personalized by including individual student's attendance rate for the school year.
- On March 7th, representatives from Children's, Inc. spoke with the senior class in the high school cafeteria. Representatives shared information about their Summer Rise program. This specific program provides free and local resources to graduating seniors to help them transition into adulthood, post-secondary education, and the work force.
- On March 7th, a representative from Herff Jones/Graduate Services, Inc. visited DHS to distribute caps and gowns to Class of 2019 students who purchased them. Students also had the opportunity to place orders with the representative.
- On March 12th, 41 juniors took the state-required ACT. DHS celebrated these students with the following events:

- On March 20th, Mrs. Embry met and observed school counselors at Campbell County Middle School to learn more about their social and emotional programming.

- In preparation for the 2019-2020 school year, Mrs. Embry visited English classes and discussed high school transcripts, DHS graduation requirements, and schedule requests with students in grades 8-11. Students completed Schedule Request forms and were asked to receive parent/guardian permission before submitting them to their English teachers or the Guidance Office by March 25th.

- On March 28th, Mrs. Embry will be attending a Youth Mental Health First Aid Training at the University of Louisville. The training will provide her with tools to better help our students who are experiencing mental health or addiction challenges, or who are in crisis.

- On March 29th, Mrs. Embry will receive proctor training on EdReady at Gateway's Boone Campus. With the access and use of EdReady, both our dual credit and technical school students will have the ability to remediate at their level on their own time. The service is FREE to our school through the partnership with Gateway.
