Immigrant students routinely participate in their schools Extended School Services (ESS) program to receive additional academic support. However,

funding would allow ELL/ESL/MEP staff to work with our immigrant students on a weekly basis and ensure student access to personnel who have been trained to provide services to immigrant children and youth throughout the school year. ESS funding and time frames vary from school to school and may not be sufficient to meet the individual needs of our immigrant students.
