Mar 27, 2020: Paris

Bienvenue à Paris! Meet your ACIS Tour Manager and get acquainted with this graceful city's cobblestoned streets, charming cafés and vibrant neighborhoods. Paris is called the "City of Light" for its role as a center of education during the Age of Enlightenment (it was also one the first cities to adopt streetlights). Perhaps stroll through Montmartre to the whitedomed Sacré Cœur or seek out a lesser known but equally interesting attraction such as the Musée Marmottan-Monet, housing the artist's Impression, Sunrise—the painting for which the Impressionist movement was named. After dinner your tour manager will show you the dazzling shops, cafés and bustling sidewalks of the Champs-Élysées before you ascend to the top of the Arc de Triomphe. Enjoy the spectacular view of twelve of Paris's Grands Boulevards which extend from the monument like spokes on a wheel to the Place de la Concorde and the Louvre. (D)


Mar 28, 2020: Paris

Your day begins with a guided sightseeing tour that takes you past some of the most famous attractions in Paris. Your expert local guide will show you the splendid Seine, Napoleon's final resting place at Les Invalides and the Gothic wonder of Notre Dame.This afternoon, breeze by the crowds with your timed entrance to the Louvre and discover the many famous masterpieces that call it home. Insightful commentary from your local guide highlights the Mona Lisa, Winged Victory, Venus de Milo and more as you wander through the galleries. From its beginnings as a royal fortress to its current status as the world's most visited art museum, the Louvre has long been at the center of Parisian culture and home to a collection of 35,000 works of art from around the world. Tonight attend a night at the French theater—a unique cultural experience alongside the locals made accessible with English surtitles (translations shown above the stage).(B,D)

Mar 29, 2020: Normandy Area

Drive along the Seine to Rouen. Its soaring cathedral is among France's most beautiful. View the marketplace, site of Joan of Arc's martyrdom on May 30, 1431, and the streets of Rouen with halftimbered dwellings. Continue to your hotel in Normandy. (B,D) **Mar 30, 2020: St Malo**

Today walk in the footsteps of history as you visit many of Normandy's important World War II sites. See what remains of the temporary Mulberry harbor constructed at Arromanches to help offload cargo during the invasion. Entrance to the Arromanches 360 Cinema is included. Next you can pay tribute to the heroic fallen at the American Cemetery and Memorial at Colleville-sur-Mer before descending from the bluff to walk along Omaha Beach, where American troops suffered some of the heaviest D-Day losses. Journey on to St. Malo, perched on seaside cliffs and still surrounded by ramparts built in defense from Corsair pirates. (B,D)



Mar 31, 2020: Loire Valley

This morning visit the lovely island monastery of Mont St. Michel. This medieval abbey, once an important pilgrimage site, is surrounded by water at high tide. Then continue to the Loire Valley, your home for the next two nights. (B,D)

Apr 1, 2020: Loire Valley

First up today is Chenonceau, the château of six women, built over the River Cher in an exquisite Renaissance design. It features a moat, drawbridge, towers and turrets—and great stories about resistance to the Nazi army. We then move on to our lunch stop in the town of Amboise, where Leonardo da Vinci is buried. This afternoon, visit an authentic French fromagerie to experience life in the French countryside, learn about the cheese making process and taste some of the fromage for which the area is famous. (B,D)


Apr 2, 2020: Paris

This morning we'll visit impressive Chambord, the giant hunting lodge of François I that towers over its deer-filled park. Then continue Versailles. Your visit includes the Hall of Mirrors, where the Treaty of Versailles was signed, and the breathtaking surroundings. Don't worry if you don't have time to cover every room of his vast palace. The best stuff is all in the gardens and grounds: all 1,976-acre gardens, 200,000 trees, 50 fountains and 620 jets of water worth. Travel on to Paris for dinner. (B,D) **Apr 3, 2020: Departure**

Depart for the USA.

Optional Extensions and Extra Nights:

Enhance your European experience with a two-night extension to London via Eurostar, including a city sightseeing tour with an expert local guide, entrance to the Tower of London and an Oyster Card to help you get around. (B) *This is a preliminary itinerary for your group.*







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learning objectives

1. Students will examine the role monuments play in Paris' history as represented in such renowned and imposing examples as the Arc de Triomphe and the Eiffel Tower.

2. Students will learn of many historical passages across the English Channel, from the Norman Conquest of England and the Hundred Years' War to the Normandy Landings of WWII.

3. Students will gain a sense of the interconnectedness of American and French history as they explore the American War Cemetery and Omaha Beach while learning about the strategy and tragedy of the D-Day invasions.


