The purpose of the meeting was to share the information NKCES had collected over several weeks and to finalize a plan for sharing with the business community.

Special Education Update

DoSE Meetings: The DoSE Advisory group met on April 22 and the DoSE met at Ralph Rush on April 26. The DoSE Advisory group reviewed applications for the Regional DoSE position and recommended five candidates to Mrs. Razor. The DoSE Advisory also discussed the KDE Proposal process and made recommendations for the structure of a new special education advisory board requested by KDE.

State Directors Meeting: Dr. Laura Clarke and Ms. Diane Hatfield attended the state directors meeting in Lexington.

Special Ed Teachers PLC: Dr. Laura Clarke hosted a blended (live and virtual) Special Ed PLC on April 17. This PLC was held at NKCES and included a web conference link so participants could join live or by Zoom. This session was a "make and take" of progress monitoring forms and processes.

State Consultant Work: NKCES consultants continued collaborative work in the areas of literacy, mathematics, behavior and low incidence.

Behavior Institute 2019 planning: On April 13, Dr. Laura Clarke participated in the KY CEC Behavior Institute planning session. Dr. Clarke and Mrs. Stephanie Turner are slated to offer presentations at the Behavior Institute, which anticipates around 2,000 attendees on June 13-14 at the Louisville Convention Center.

The Power of Teamwork 2.0: On April 26, 2019, Ted Wiese presented "The Power of Teamwork 2.0" at the NKCES/OVR high school transition forum held at Receptions Event Center in Erlanger, KY. Forty-three students from six high schools participated in this high energy, hands-on team building workshop. To intensify the challenge, school clans were divided into opposing teams, giving students the opportunity to join ranks with neighboring high schools.

Professional Learning (PL) Update

April Professional Learning: NKCES supported a total of 70 professional learning opportunities focused on academics, culture and climate and special education

Williamstown Independent **PL Consortium**: A subcommittee was established to collaborate regarding the Essential Workplace Ethics Program. The PL Consortium also discussed possible regional opportunities and common curriculum needs.

Specially Designed Instruction in Mathematics: On April 23, NKCES brought together K-12 math teachers for Specially Designed Instruction in Mathematics. Teachers using concrete-to-semi-concrete to-to-abstract (CSA) sequence of instruction investigated new ways to teach difficult math concepts. CSA is an evidenced-based instructional practice to support students with learning disabilities struggle to acquire essential mathematical concepts and skills.

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs): During the month of April several PLCs met including: Special Education, Visual / Performing Arts, and Instructional Coaches. PLCs provide opportunities for educators to grow professionally in a collaborative environment focused on collective learning.

Instructional Coaches PLC: Instructional Coaches gathered on April 23 for their last face-to-face meeting of the year. 17 Instructional coaches from 11 member school districts and NKCES were in attendance. Topics of discussion included the revised Kentucky Academic Standards, planning for next school year, and upcoming opportunities available through KDE.

Visual/Performing Arts PLC: At the April 11 Visual/Performing Arts PLC, Dayton High School's visual art teacher, Cheryl Spahr, shared technology tools for the art classroom, and Joe Bertucci shared resources from "The Art of Comprehension," connecting students' analysis of visual art to literacy.

Regional School Programs (RSP) Update:

Advisory Board met 4/16/19. Updated RSP procedures were reviewed for discussion and feedback.

Kroger Community project will be here June 4th to implement their project plans for RSP.

RSP testing window is 5/6/19 - 5/10-19. Thank you to staff from NKCES helping during testing.

English Learners (EL) Program Update:

This month, the EL Consultants provided direct services to students until ACCESS scores were received on the 23rd. We then began preparing reports for each district to show students' progress over time. We also began scheduling meetings with each district and with each student's teachers to review the students' ACCESS scores, grades, and informal data to begin planning for their Program Service Plans for the 2019-20 school year. We helped to plan the NKY EL PLC which will work with EL teachers to analyze and discuss their students' data with their staff.

NKY Institute for Arts Education (NKIAE):

Teachers working to integrate the arts with math are currently completing 3 hours of virtual learning in Google Classroom, in preparation for our summer workshop.

Our regional Steering Committee met on April 18 to continue planning our 2019-20 Program.

We are also working with our evaluator to submit our annual performance report, due to the U.S. Department of Education on May 3.
