An outstanding high school athlete, Zeb led his Cumberland High School (Elkhorn City) team to three regional championships and state tournament appearances in 1943, 1944 and 1945. He was named to the All-State team in his senior year of 1945 and played his freshman year of college at the University of Kentucky before being drafted into the military and serving in the United States Army. His administrative career began in 1962 and stretched through 1981, with his basketball coaching career spanning 10 years. He served as high school principal at both Mercer County High School (five years) and at Jessamine County High School (14 years). During this time he served as a valued member of the KHSAA Board of Control and as its President for three years.

John Bond turned Cumberland into a small school mountain powerhouse throughout the 1980s and 1990s, leading the Lady Skins to a pair of state tournament appearances in the 1980s and the first two All "A" Classic state titles in the early 1990s. He inherited a program that had won only game in the first year of girls basketball in Kentucky in the fall of 1976 and led a steady improvement from three wins in his first year to 10 the next year, then 12 and then 21 in 1979. By 1981, Cumberland ended Cawood's run of five straight 52nd District titles. Cumberland made its first trip to the Sweet Sixteen in 1984 in Richmond and returned two years later in Bowling Green, becoming the first Harlan County team to win a game in the state tournament by knocking off Miss Basketball Kris Miller and Owensboro Catholic. Now in his 52nd year of teaching, Bond continues his lifelong passion of working with students while volunteering as the middle school coach at Cumberland, touching the lives of yet another generation of Harlan Countians. A 1961 graduate of Benham High School, Bond was a baseball and basketball standout at the small coal mining town before moving on to the University of Kentucky. He earned degrees at UK in 1966 and 1971 before returning to the Tri-Cities area of Harlan County to begin a long teaching and coaching career.

A five-year letterman at Meade Memorial (1951-55) who scored 2,400 career points. A three-time All-District and two-time All-Region selection, he earned 1st Team All-State honors in 1955. Meade won a pair of 59th District Championships during his career, and enjoyed a perfect 27-0 regular season record in 1955 before losing in the 15th Region finals. Went on to star at Pikeville College, scoring 2,073 points, and was selected in the 7th Round of the 1961 NBA Draft by the New York Knicks. Played two seasons for the Knicks and two seasons for the Detroit Pistons, scoring 1,696 points, grabbing 821 rebounds and dishing out 585 assists over 279 career NBA games. Was named head coach of the Pistons on March 8, 1967, compiling a 52-60 record until he was relieved of his duties in December of 1968. Went on to enjoy a long career with Converse. Was inducted into the Pikeville College Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989.

Billy Chumbler scored a school record 2,080 points at Lowe's HS and was named Purchase Area Player of the Year and First Team All-State in 1962 and 1963. Chumbler was also recognized by Street and Smith magazine as an All-America Honorable Mention selection. He went on to play at Mississippi State University and Murray State University. After a successful career coaching in Illinois he returned to Kentucky and coached Paducah Tilghman, leading them to eight-straight district titles, three trips to the Sweet 16 and a State Runner-up finish in 1996. He last coached at Trigg County where they won three district championships and had three consecutive 20-win seasons for the first time in school history.

A three-time letterman, Cooper led Corydon HS to appearances in the 1928 and 1929 state tournament, advancing to the semifinals in 1929. Reported to have scored more than 500 points during the 1928-29 season, despite playing in an era when most teams didn't score that many points in a season. Named All-State by the Madisonville Messenger in 1929. Cited as one of the pioneers of the basketball "jump shot" according to the book Big Leagues: Professional Baseball, Football and Basketball in National Memory. Played at Hopkinsville HS as a senior, winning a 4th District championship, before moving on to the University of Missouri. Earned three letters in basketball for the Tigers and was the leading scorer in the Big Six Conference and a unanimous 1st Team All-Conference in 1932. Also lettered in football (1932) and track (1933 and 1934) at Missouri. In the NCAA rule book, Cooper is cited as the first player to popularize the jump shot (1932-34). Graduated with a PhD in Education from Missouri in 1946 and went on to a decorated career in education. Wrote over 20 books in his teaching career, including The Theory and Science of Basketball in 1969. Was inducted into the Missouri Athletic Hall of Fame in 1992.

Mr. Cowden took over the girls and boys Golf program in the spring of 1971 and serves as head coach to this day (48 seasons and counting)- though the coaching position is now shared with his daughter, Tori, as the head girls varsity coach. While at HCHS he also coached tennis, and drove after school weekend field trips. He often volunteers his time to transport students to various events. In 1974 he initiated the first modern Girls Basketball program at HCHS. In his 12 years as the girls' basketball coach his teams won five District 11 tournaments (with six district runner-up finishes) and recorded one Region 3 runner-up finish. His final record was 175 wins and 144 "Not So Well". He resigned from coaching Basketball in 1986, but kept the golf position and became Athletic Director, serving in that capacity for 19 years. As Athletic Director he also served on the 3rd Region Policy Board for eight years (4 years as president) and the KHSAA Golf Committee for 11 years.

Cummins played basketball for four seasons at Brooksville from 1941-1944, scoring 793 points. He played for the 1944 Brooksville Polar Bears that were undefeated at 22-0 in the regular season, and ranked the #1 team in Kentucky. Brooksville finished its season at 27-1 when they were upset in second round of the State Tournament. He was named to the State All-Tournament Team and First-Team All-State in 1944. He also played baseball for Brooksville, and was their ace pitcher and middle-infielder, where he won a Region Championship and State Runner-Up title in 1944. Cummins, and the entire 1944 starting five was offered a scholarship to Kentucky by Adolph Rupp. Albert, however, was drafted and served in the Navy in 1945 and 1946. He returned to Kentucky to play basketball in the 1947 and 1948 seasons, where he played in 38 games and scored 52 points, winning two SEC Championships. He also lettered in baseball in 1947, but decided to transfer after that, leaving the Kentucky team that would win the 1948 and 1949 NCAA Championship. In honor of his achievements, Cummins was inducted to the 10th Region Hall of Fame and the Bracken County Athletic Hall of Fame in 2018.

One of the most successful coaches in 13th Region history, Mike Jones posted a 613-255 record in 28 seasons as a boys basketball coach in a career that included stops at Cawood, Jackson County, Todd Central, Harlan, Clay County and Harlan County. After winning 85 games in four years at Cawood, including a regional runner-up finish in 1986 with all-stater Nick Sanford, Jones left for Jackson County and stayed four years. After one season at Todd Central, Jones returned to Harlan County in the fall of 1991 to begin an amazing eight-year run as the Harlan coach. The Green Dragons won 205 games in eight years under Jones, winning 13th Region titles in 1993, 1995 and 1996 and Kentucky All "A" Classic state titles in 1994 and 1995. Jones coached several more all-staters at Harlan, including 1995 Mr. Basketball Charles Thomas. After a six-year stint at Clay County, which included his fourth regional championship in 2001, Jones retired from coaching for three years and returned to Harlan County as an administrator at Cawood High School. Jones was named the first coach at Harlan County High School in the summer of 2008. Jones led the Bears through a gradual rise in the ranks of the 13th Region. The Bears won 19 games in 2010, then 20 in 2011 and 27 in 2012. Harlan County won its second district title in a 25-8 campaign in 2013 and advanced to the 13th Region Tournament finals.

Potts was a volleyball official almost from the inception of the sport in Kentucky. He was selected to officiate 14 KHSAA State Championships. In addition he worked at least 35 regional tournaments in regions 6, 7 and 8 that I can document and in all likelihood many more than that. Many years he worked multiple regional tournaments. He also worked at least 40 district tournaments in the same area. Again, that number is probably much higher but our association does not have records that far back. He was without question one of the best volleyball officials in the state but the things that set him apart was his ability to communicate and his obvious passion for the game.
