In baseball, he compiled 579 wins with Nicholas County, Deming, and Williamstown. Coach Anderson led the Blue Jackets to 21 regional tournament appearances and in 2000 won the 10th Region & Semi-State Championship. In 1988 he was elected to the 10th Region Coaches Hall of Fame. In 1997 he was a charter member of the Kentucky High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Billy is a 1955 graduate of Nicholas County & 1960 graduate of Morehead State University where he pitched baseball and helped the Eagles win an OVC Championship in 1957.

The longtime girls' basketball head coach at Hazard HS, Fannin accumulated over 500 wins during his career and guided the Lady Bulldogs to the KHSAA Girls' Sweet 16 state championship in 1997. Hazard captured three-straight 14th Region Championships from 1995-97. Fannin's coaching accolades included a 14th Region and 54th District Coach of the Year award. He received the 14th Region's Most Outstanding Coaching Career award and was inducted into the KABC Court of Honor in 2009. Fannin's impact extended past girls' basketball, as he coached boys' basketball and fast pitch softball at Hazard as well, winning a 14th Region title in both sports. During his playing career, Fannin broke numerous records at Carr Creek HS during the 1960's before continuing his education at Cumberland College, where he set the record for Free Throw percentage.

Head baseball coach, assistant and head boys' basketball coach, and head girls' basketball coach at Leslie County High School. A member of the Leslie County High School Athletic Hall of Fame, Don Lane Transylvania Basketball Camp Hall of Fame, and Kentucky High School Coaches Association 14th Region Court of Honor. The gymnasium floor at Leslie County High School bears the name "Coach Wilson Court". Also, every December LCHS holds an one-day event for girls and boys' basketball, called the "Coach Wilson" Classic, in honor of Coach Wilson.

Gary "Tuck" Woolum quarterbacked the 1978 Pineville football team in his senior season; throwing for 2000+ yards and 26 TDs. The "hard work", "love for the game" and "110% effort" that was so often seen by his peers and coaches aided him in receiving a scholarship from ECU. It was there, as their QB, that he led the Colonels to the 1982 1AA National Championship and a perfect 13-0 record. Tuck went on to coach at Citadel, Western Carolina and Union College before returning home to Pineville to teach and coach at the high school.
