

Simpson County Schools PBIS team 3rd quarter update 2018-2019

Franklin Elementary

FES has had 65 referrals through the 3rd quarter. This is .21 referrals per day per 100 students. This is below the national average of .35 per day per 100 students for elementary schools and is also ahead of our goal for elementary schools of .225

27 students have received at least 1 office referral this year, and 5 of those students account for 30 referrals, which is a little under half of all referrals.

FES is continuing to work with teachers on improving classroom management strategies with the goal of helping students understand how to better regulate their own behavior and prepare them to enter SES

Mr. Perdue and Mrs. Chaney are working with students that have the highest number of referrals in their social skills group.

Simpson Elementary

SES had 117 discipline referrals through the 3rd qtr. This is .15 referrals per day per 100 students. This is better than the national average of .35 per day per 100 students, and ahead of our goal of 225.

5 students account for 40 referrals. (about 1/3)

45 students have received an office referral this year, and 27 students have received 2 or more referrals. This means that around 625 students have received 1 or 0 office referrals

75 of the 117 referrals come from students with an IE

56 of the 117 referrals are for physical aggression

Suspensions are on par with the previous 3 year

For next school year SES intends to focus on improving their tier 2 and tier 3 interventions

Lincoln Elementary

LES has had 76 referrals through the first semester. This is .13 referrals per day per 100 students. This is ahead of the national average for elementary schools of .35 referrals per day per 100 students, and ahead of our goal of .225 per day per 100.

41 students have 1 or more referrals. This means that about 440 students have no referrals.

4 students have 5 or more referrals accounting for 22 (about 1/3

22 referrals are for fighting or physical aggression, and 13 are for technology violations

LES has seen an increase in technology violations as they are now a 1 to 1 school. They are working on their rules regarding the use of technology, and communication of those rules to students.

The new Family Resource Center serving Lincoln Elementary and Franklin Elementary is actively working with the administrative staff on plans for providing rewards and celebrations for students that are consistently meeting expectations.

FSMS

FSMS has had 676 discipline referrals through the 3rd quarter. This is .84 referrals per day per 100 students. While this is better than the national average for middle schools of .9 referrals per day per 100 students, it does not meet our goal of .65 per day per 100 students.

126 students have 2 or more referrals. This means that about 520 students have 0 or 1 referral.

The 6th grade class has 250 referrals, which is 75 above the 3 year average for 6th grades.

31 students have 7 or more referrals.

FSMS is going to continue with tier 2 and tier 3 behavior meetings where admin staff, student support staff and key teachers that are involved with the students being discussed will meet to look at what strategies are in place for these students. The team will meet every 4-6 weeks. FSMS will also look at ways to build their tier 2 and tier 3 toolboxes over the summer.

FSMS admin staff will also develop a plan to help teachers improve classroom management strategies.

FSHS

FSHS had 682 referrals through the 3rd quarter. This is .68 referrals per day per 100 students. This is better than the national average for high schools of 1 per day per 100 students and ahead of our goal of .7 per day per 100 students.

124 students have had 2 or more referrals. This means that about 690 students have had 1 or 0 referrals.

227 referrals are for defiance, disrespect, and off task behaviors in the classroom.

The administration at FSHS is looking at ways to increase physical activity for all students during the school day, and not just those that have PE in hopes that we would see less off task behavior and a better ability to focus when it's time to focus.

West Campus

West Campus has had 147 referrals through the 2nd quarter.

23 students have had more than 1 referral

7 students have 8 or more referrals accounting for 84 of the 147 total referrals.
