- How do we enrich and stretch the learning of our students who are meeting or exceeding our learning goals?









FES students are grouped together based on cognitive ability and K readiness. Additional academic and social learning options are available too. Teachers provide encouragement for students to meet academic and social milestones

SES students participate in academic flex groups to meet their cognitive need. Students are challenged daily to persevere as they meet set academic learning targets.

FSHS students are exposed to multiple digital platforms in all classes. Many students take advantage of furthering their digital awareness through digital media classes, website development, or computer application courses. All classes work to build capacity and citizenship in our digital world.

SES students participate in personalized learning through Super Simpson Classes. Third grade students are universally screened for divergent thinking.
