- (E) Refund policy. Morehead Parks and Recreation will issue a fifty percent (50%) refund for program registration fees if a refund request form is submitted prior to the participant being placed on a team; except for medical reasons or relocation of participant. A refund will not be issued once a participant is placed on a team. Refunds will be issued in the form of a check approximately two (2) to four (4) weeks after the request is made. Said request shall be submitted on a form provided by the city to the activity/program director for approval.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

§ 39.15 PURPOSE.

Use of internet social media sites is a popular activity. Employees are permitted to use personal social networking; however, employees must be mindful of the negative impact of inappropriate or unauthorized postings upon the City of Morehead and its relationship with the community. The purpose of this policy is to give employees guidance regarding inappropriate content for personal social media websites, web pages, and other electronically transmitted or hard copied material with respect to the city and to clearly identify prohibited activities by employees both on and off duty in order to protect the City of Morehead, its employees and Board of Council from harm as the result of inappropriate postings or inadvertent harmful postings. This policy is not meant to address one particular form of social media; rather social media in general, as advances in technology will occur and new tools will emerge. Further, the policy is not intended to hinder professional development of any employee or interfere with an employee's First Amendment rights.

§ 39.16 POLICY.

The City of Morehead recognizes that social media provides a new and potentially valuable means of assisting the City of Morehead and personnel in meeting community outreach, problem-solving, investigation, crime prevention, and related objectives. This policy identifies potential uses that may be explored or expanded upon as deemed reasonable by administrative and supervisory personnel. Further, the City of Morehead recognizes the role that these tools play in the lives of city government employee, both in their personal lives and official capacity and acknowledges that its employees have the right under the First Amendment, in certain circumstances, to speak out on matters of public concern not related to their official duties. However, the city will regulate the use of social media by employees, including employees' personal use of social media, when such use interferes with or disrupts the work of the city, is used to harass coworkers or other members of city government, breaches confidentiality obligations of city employees, creates a hostile work environment or violates the law or city policies/ordinances. § 39.17 DEFINITIONS.

"BLOG." A self-published diary or commentary on a particular topic that may allow visitors to post responses, reactions or comments. The term is short for "Web Log".

\$ 51.01 GAS AND WATER TAP CHARGES.

- (A) No free use of the services and facilities of the municipal utility system of the city (hereinafter the "system") shall be granted or permitted to any user thereof, including the City of Morehead.
- (B) Effective July 1, 2016, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any water line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for residential purposes shall be eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) each for such water tap.
- (C) Effective September 1, 2009, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any water line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for industrial or commercial purposes shall be the actual cost of labor and material incurred by the Morehead Utility Plant Board.
- (D) Effective July 1, 2016, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any gas line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for residential purposes shall be seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) each for such gas tap.
- (E) Effective September 1, 2009, the cost for any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any gas line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board for industrial or commercial purposes shall be the actual cost of labor and material incurred by the Morehead Utility Plant Board.
- (F) Upon payment of the connection or tapping charge the Morehead Utility Plant Board shall cause the connection or tapping to be made.
- (G) Any party making any connection without payment of the connection or tapping charge or violating any provision of this section, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and each day's violation shall be deemed a separate offense. \$ 51.02 SERVICE RATES AND CHARGES.

(A) Rates and charges for the use of the water and gas services and facilities of the system shall be based on the consumption of water, and rates and charges for the use of the gas services and facilities of the system shall be based on the consumption of gas. Rates and charges shall be at least adequate to meet the cost of maintaining, repairing, and operating the system, and making required principal and interest payments and deposits to the debt service or depreciation reserve. On that basis, monthly rates and charges are established and fixed, and will be maintained, at not less than the following:

All charges shall be on a pro rata basis per gas consumption over minimum bill. A minimum bill shall be paid by all customers in an amount to equal the MUPB's actual cost of one thousand (1,000) MCF, from supplier of natural gas plus three dollars and forty-five cents (\$3.45).

- (C) Rates and charges for customers of gas service located outside the corporate limits of the city shall be one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the rate schedule which is to be charged to customers located within the corporate limits of the city.
- (D) The industrial charge for gas purchases over $5,000~\mathrm{MCF}$ shall be as follows:

\$3.45 over purchase cost to MUPB from supplier per first 1,000 MCF and \$1.60 over purchase cost per each additional 1,000 MCF up to

§ 52.71 TAP FEES.

- (A) Effective July 1, 2016, any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any residential sewer line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board shall first pay to the Morehead Utility Plant Board a connection or tapping charge as follows:
- (1) Gravity. Eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the first tap and two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each additional tap made off of the service line from the first tap.
- (2) Grinder Pump. Three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) each for such tap.
- (B) Effective July 1, 2016, any person, firm, corporation or legal entity desiring to connect or tap onto any industrial or commercial sewer line of the City of Morehead/Morehead Utility Plant Board shall first pay to the Morehead Utility Plant Board a connection or tapping charge as follows:
- (1) Gravity. Minimum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) plus twenty dollars (\$20.00) per fixture over twenty (20) fixtures. A fixture is as defined by the plumbing code.
- (2) Grinder Pump. The actual cost of materials and labor with a minimum cost of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) each for such tap. (Ord. 18:2009, passed 8-10-09; Am. Ord. 07:2016, passed 6-13-16)

\$ 52.72 CHARGES AND FEES.

- (A) The city may adopt additional charges and fees which may include:
- (1) Fees for reimbursement of costs of setting up and operating the city's pretreatment program;
- (2) Fees for monitoring, inspections and surveillance procedures;
- (3) Fees for reviewing accidental discharge procedures and construction;
 - (4) Fees for permit applications;
 - (5) Fees for filing appeals;
- (6) Fees for consistent removal by the POTW of excessive strength conventional pollutants;
- (7) Fees for all costs directly related to investigation of a prohibited discharge;
- (8) Other fees as the city may deem necessary to carry out the requirements contained herein.

- (C) (1) For those users whose waste water has a greater strength than normal domestic waste water as defined in 52.31(J), a surcharge in addition to the normal user charge will be imposed and collected.
- (2) The following surcharge rates shall apply to each user of the treatment works that has received permission from the superintendent or designated authority to contribute waste water with a greater strength than normal domestic waste water:

where the formula giving the larger surcharge payment will be used each month.

- (4) Where formula components are as follows:
 - A. Surcharge rate for BOD_5 , in \$/pound.
 - B. Surcharge rate for TSS, in \$/pound.
 - C. Surcharge rate for NH3N, in \$/pound.
 - G. Surcharge rate for O&G (Total), in \$/pound.
 - J. Surcharge rate for COD, in \$/pound.
 - D. User's average BOD₅ concentration, in mg/l.
 - E. User's average TSS concentration, in mg/l.
 - F. User's average NH₃N concentration, in mg/l
 - H. User's average O&G (Total), in mg/l.
 - K. User's average COD concentration, mg/l.
 - M. User's monthly flow to sanitary sewer system, per 1,000 gallons.

No reduction in wastewater service charges, fees, or taxes shall be permitted because of the fact that certain wastes discharged to the wastewater works contain less than normal domestic wastewater contaminant limits.

- (5) The Superintendent of the Morehead Utility Plant Board may require pretreatment of wastes containing other pollutants before discharge to the city's sewers is approved. Such treatment, if required, shall be based on the type and quantity of pollutant.

(A) The applicable fees pertaining to the discharge of trucked and/or hauled wastes into the city's sanitary sewer system shall be as follows:

- (1) An application fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall accompany each permit application to cover the cost of the discharge permit for a period of one (1) year. New permit applications received during the year shall be pro-rated based on the number of full months remaining in the year;
- (2) Fees for all costs incurred by the MUPB in monitoring, inspections, and surveillance procedures may be assessed. These fees will only be billed on an extraordinary basis unless otherwise deemed necessary by the General Superintendent;
- (3) Fees for all costs directly related to investigation of a prohibited discharge may be assessed to the source of such discharge;
- (4) Fees for all costs incurred as a result of the filing of appeals may be assessed to the appellant; and
- (5) Other fees and expenses for all costs incurred by the MUPB to carry out the requirements contained in this chapter may be assessed.

\$ 52.80 RIGHT TO ENTER PREMISES.

The General Superintendent and other duly authorized employees and representatives of the city and authorized representatives of applicable federal and state regulatory agencies bearing proper credentials and identification shall be permitted to enter all properties for the purpose of inspection, observation, records examination and copying, measurement, sampling, and testing pertinent to discharges to the public sewer system in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

S 94.06 MOTOR VEHICLE AND WATERCRAFT TAX RATE ASSESSMENT.

The 2019 motor vehicle and watercraft tax rate for the city is hereby established at twenty-two cents (\$.22) per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation. § 111.01 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

"INSURANCE COMPANY." Any company authorized to transact insurance business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky in accordance with KRS Chapter 304. Insurance company shall also include a surplus lines broker licenses in accordance with KRS 304 Subtitle 10.

"LOCAL GOVERNMENT." The City of Morehead, Kentucky. (Ord. 02:2018, passed 2-12-18)

\$ 111.02 IMPOSITION OF FEE.

There is hereby imposed upon each insurance company a license fee for the privilege of engaging in the business of insurance within the corporate limits of the City of Morehead effective July 1, 2018 and thereafter on a calendar year basis. (Ord. passed - -84; Am. Ord. 02:2018, passed 2-12-18)

§ 111.03 LICENSE FEE FOR COMPANIES ISSUING LIFE INSURANCES.

The license fee imposed upon each insurance company which issues life insurance policies on the lives of persons residing within the corporate limits of the city shall be 7.5% of the first year's premiums actually collected within each calendar quarter by reason of the issuance of such policies.

§ 111.04 LICENSE FEE FOR COMPANIES ISSUING POLICIES OTHER THAN LIFE INSURANCE.

The license fee imposed upon each insurance company which issues any insurance policy which is not a life insurance policy shall be 7.5% of the premiums actually collected within each calendar quarter by reason of the issuance of such policies on risks located within the corporate limits of the city on those classes of business which such company is authorized to transact, less all premiums returned to

policyholders: however, any license fee imposed upon premium receipts shall not include premiums received for those policies listed in KRS 91A.080(10) and (13). (Ord. 02:2018, passed 2-12-18)

\$ 111.05 DUE DATE; INTEREST ON DELINQUENT PAYMENTS.

All license fees imposed by this chapter shall be due no later than 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter. The payment shall be submitted to the local government, together with Form LGT-141 on or before the due date. License fees which are not paid on or before the due date shall bear interest from the date due until paid at the interest rate established annually by the Department of Revenue for unpaid or underpaid fees/taxes. § 113.08 GENERAL PROHIBITIONS.

- (A) No person, firm, or corporation holding a license under this chapter to sell alcoholic beverages of any kind, shall give away or offer to give anything tangible of value as a premium or prize, or for any other purpose in connection with the sale of alcoholic beverages. All sales of alcohol shall be for cash only.
- (B) No person, firm, or corporation holding a license under this chapter to sell alcoholic beverages at retail shall permit any person or persons other than employees of the licensee, to open any bottle of distilled spirits or wine, nor allow said contents consumed on the licensed premises unless the licensee has the proper licenses.
- (C) No person, firm, or corporation holding a license under this chapter to sell any alcoholic beverages shall permit any person to become drunk or intoxicated on the premises, nor shall any licensee permit any drunk or intoxicated person to remain on the licensed premises.
- (D) No person, firm or corporation holding a license under this chapter to sell alcoholic beverages shall maintain distilled spirits or malt beverages outside of the locked or closed-off departments of any premises at which a license is held to sell distilled spirits at retail at any hours during which the licensee is prohibited by the Kentucky Alcoholic Beverage Control Act or by this chapter from selling said distilled spirits or malt beverages. If distilled spirits or malt beverages are found outside of the locked or closed-off departments, then a prima facie presumption shall arise that such distilled spirits or malt beverages were kept on the outside of the locked or closed-off department for the purpose of sale in violation of this chapter and the State Alcoholic Beverage Control Act and shall be grounds for revocation or suspension of the license, and in addition to other penalties provided for violation of this section the Local Administrator is authorized to confiscate such distilled spirits or malt beverages. This section shall also apply to wine.
- (E) No person shall sell, give away or deliver any alcoholic beverages or procure or permit alcoholic beverages to be sold, given away or delivered to any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years.
- (F) No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall purchase or attempt to purchase, or have another purchase for him or her, any alcoholic beverage at any premises licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages. It shall be unlawful likewise for any person to aid or assist any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years in purchasing or having delivered or served to him or her, any such alcoholic beverage on or off such premises.
- (G) No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall misrepresent His or her age for the purpose of inducing any retail licensee, or an employee of any retail licensee, to sell or serve any alcoholic beverages to him or her.

- (H) No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall possess in the city, any alcoholic beverages outside of the confines of his or her abode or residence. Any alcoholic beverages found in possession of such person shall be liable to seizure as contraband.
- (I) No person, firm, or corporation conducting a place of business in the city patronized by and open to the general public or any private club as defined in the Kentucky Revised Statutes, who does not hold the necessary licenses, as herein provided, shall sell, barter, loan, give away, or drink any alcoholic beverages on the premises of his or her place of business, nor shall any proprietor of such unlicensed premises patronized by and open to the general public or any agent or employee of such proprietor, have in his or her possession any alcoholic beverages on any portion of his or her premises which is open to the general public.
 - (J) Hours for sale and consumption.
- (1) Retail package distilled spirits, wine and malt beverages licensees shall be permitted to sell Monday through Saturday at all hours except for the period between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. prevailing time, and on Sundays between 12:00 midnight and 12:00 p.m.
- (2) A licensee for distilled spirits, wine and/or malt beverages by the drink shall be permitted to sell or dispense alcoholic beverages by the drink Monday through Saturday, from 6:000 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. of the following day, and on Sunday from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m., on Monday, provided that the appropriate licenses and 1:00 a.m., approvals have been obtained from both the city and the state ABC Board.
- (3) Consumption of alcoholic beverages on licensed premises may not continue for more than thirty (30) minutes after the respective hours set forth herein for sales to stop.
- (K) No retailer, except one holding the required license, as defined in this chapter shall permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages upon the premises unless it holds a separate retail drink license.
- No person, firm or corporation holding a license under this chapter shall sell any alcoholic beverages behind blinds or screens, but such sales shall be conducted openly and without any attempt to hide or screen it from public view. Further, the entrance of any premises for which a retail license has been issued shall be of clear glass and permit an unobstructed view. The premises shall be so erected and maintained as to furnish a clear view of the premises from the sidewalk, or, if the premises are not on the street level, from the entrance. No partition, box, stall, screen, curtain or other device shall obstruct the view or the general observations of persons, but partitions, subdivisions, or panels that are not higher than forty-eight (48) inches from the floor shall not be construed as obstructing the view of the general observation of persons.

- (M) No person, firm, or corporation holding a license under this chapter shall permit gambling, dice, slot machines or any game of chance of any sort in any form upon licensed premises. This subsection shall not apply to the sale of lottery tickets sold under the provisions of KRS Chapter 154A or the conduct of charitable gaming by a charitable organization licensed and regulated under the provision of KRS Chapter 238.
- (N) No distributor or retail dealer shall buy any alcoholic beverage in the city except from a person holding a license in conformity with this chapter.
- (O) Every person, firm, or corporation holding a license under this chapter shall not have or maintain any radio receiving apparatus on such premises which is intentionally adjusted so as to receive police messages. In addition to other penalties provided for the violation of this section, the Chief of Police or the Local Administrator shall have the authority to confiscate any and all such radio receiving apparatus.
- (P) All restrictions and prohibitions relating to the manufacture, storage, sale, purchase, transporting or other traffic in alcoholic beverages under this chapter and the Kentucky Revised Statutes and rules and regulations promulgated by the ABC Board shall have application to the nonquota type 3 retail drink license. § 113.09 DANCING REGULATIONS.

- (A) License requirement. Dancing shall not be permitted on any premises within the city for which an alcoholic beverage license is held unless a dancing license is obtained from the city for the premises. This license is not an occupational license and shall be in addition to any required occupational tax.
- (B) Application for license. Applications for dancing licenses shall be in writing, be signed by the person holding the alcoholic beverage license for the premises for which the license is applied for, in the case the applicant is a corporation, by the directors of the corporation, and designate the areas of the premises which is proposed to be used for dancing. All applications for dancing licenses shall be filed with the Local Administrator.
- (C) Inspection of premises. Upon receipt of an application for a dancing license, the Local Alcohol Beverage Control Administrator of the city shall refer the same to the Building Inspector and the Fire Chief. No dancing license shall be issued until:
- (1) The Building Inspector of the city shall have inspected the premises to be licensed and have found that the portion of the premises to be used for dancing is to be structurally safe to accommodate a dance floor.

- (2) The Fire Chief has inspected the premises to be licensed and has found the same to meet all state and city fire regulations.
- (D) Issuance of license. Upon approval of the Building Inspector and Fire Chief endorsed on the application filed with the Local Administrator, the Local Administrator shall issue a dancing license upon payment to the city of a license fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- (E) Conditions of issuance. All dancing licenses granted by the city shall be granted subject to the following conditions and all other conditions of other ordinances of the city applicable thereto:
- (1) Every licensed premises shall at all times be conducted in an orderly manner and no disorderly riotous, or indecent conduct shall be allowed at any time on any licensed premises and no nuisance suffered, permitted, or maintained thereon.
- (2) The license shall authorize dancing only on the premises of the license holder in the area designated in the application as a dance floor, except, upon approval of the Local Administrator, the dance floor may be moved from one part of the premises to another. § 113.10 WHOLESALE AND DISTRIBUTORS.

Every wholesale distributor of alcoholic beverages who sells within the city, shall report to the Local Administrator the following information:

- (A) The names of all retailers to whom alcoholic beverages were sold in the preceding quarter.
- The gross revenues received by the wholesaler or distributor (B) from each retailer.
- The total quantity of alcoholic beverages sold to each retailer in cans, cases, or kegs, as appropriate shall be provided to Local Administrator. (Ord. 5:2000, passed 5-8-00; Am. Ord. 12:2006, passed 6-12-06; Am. Ord. 28:2013, passed 11-11-13)

\$ 113.11 REGULATORY LICENSE FEE.

(A) A regulatory license fee is imposed on the gross receipts of the sale of alcoholic beverages of each licenses issued under this chapter. The license fee for the effective date, July 19, 2004 shall be four percent (4%). Thereafter the City Council shall annually adopt at the budget adoption of each fiscal year, such percentage rates as shall be reasonably estimated to insure full reimbursement to the city for the cost of any additional policing, regulatory, or administrative expenses, related to the sale of alcoholic beverages. Such fee shall be in addition to any other tax, fee, or license permitted by law, but a credit against such fee shall be allowed in amount equal to the license or fee imposed this chapter and such regulatory fee shall be applied annually.

S 150.01 KENTUCKY BUILDING AND RESIDENTIAL CODES ADOPTED.

- (A) (1) The Kentucky Building Code as promulgated in 815 KAR 7:120 and the Kentucky Residential Code as promulgated in 815 KAR 7:125 are hereby adopted in full as regulations of the city as if set out at length herein.
- (2) A copy of the Kentucky Building Code, together with a copy of all other regulations or NFiPA pamphlets adopted or referred to thereunder, is on file in the office of the City Clerk, and the Clerk shall at all times keep a copy of the building code for reference.
- (B) The City Building Inspector/Planner or his or her assistant shall be designated as the local enforcement agent for said Kentucky Building Code. Persons certified by the Kentucky Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction shall perform all building code inspections. A certified electrical inspector specifically approved by the city, pursuant to § 150.02, shall perform all electrical inspections.
- (C) Permits and fees. The fees for permits and inspections shall be provided in § 150.04.
- (D) Pursuant to KRS 198B.060(8), a building inspection program is hereby established in the city for application to all buildings including single-family dwellings as provided in the adopted codes. § 150.02 ELECTRICAL INSPECTIONS AND PERMITS.

(A) All electrical installation and alteration within and upon a building or structure except those specifically exempt by Chapter 27, Section 2703.2 of the Kentucky Building Code as adopted by § 150.01 shall not commence until a permit is obtained by the owner or electrical contractor from the Building Inspector of the City of Morehead. The fee for obtaining said permit shall be five dollars (\$5.00). Before a permit is issued the Building Inspector may make a determination that the building or structure being supplied with electrical power meets local and state codes and ordinances,

specifically housing and building codes, zoning regulations and flood plain regulations.

- (B) At the time the permit is obtained, the Building Inspector shall provide the applicant with a list of approved electrical inspectors for the City of Morehead. The owner or electrical contractor shall select one (1) of the approved certified inspectors to obtain the necessary inspections.
- (C) The city shall enter into an agreement with no more than three (3) electrical inspectors with state inspection credentials. The city will only accept electrical inspections from those inspectors approved by the city. Said approved electrical inspectors may charge the applicant the following fees:

§ 150.03 APPEALS BOARD AND APPEALS.

- (A) There is hereby established and created a Building Code Appeals Board of the city.
- (B) The purpose of the Building Code Appeals Board is to hear appeals of the decisions of the Building Inspector and/or Assistant Building Inspector of the city, such as may arise under the Kentucky Building Code.
- (C) The Building Code Appeals Board shall be in compliance with the provisions of KRS 198B.070.
- (1) The Mayor, upon the approval of the Council, shall appoint five (5) technically qualified persons with professional
