Enclosed please find the July 1, 2019 to July 1, 2020 renewal proposals provided by Liberty Mutual Insurance Company. The worker's compensation is with Kentucky Employers Mutual Insurance Company (KEMI). Below is a premium comparison vs. last year:

Please note the umbrella policy extends additional limits of liability coverage over the General Liability, Employee Benefits Liability, Auto Liability, Employers Liability, School Leaders Errors & Omissions (Board Liability), and Sexual Misconduct Liability.

Liberty Mutual has refreshed many of their coverage forms and the renewal policy will include coverage for <u>all board approved Booster Clubs</u>, student and parent groups. The policy also includes Violent Event Response Coverage with a \$300,000 limit.

As we previously discussed, the workers compensation renewal is up from \$15,791 up to \$22,007 due to an increase in the school district's experience modification. KEMI's rates have been lowered this year and their proposal keeps a 35% discount in place for Dawson Springs Schools.

THE TERROISM RISK INSURANCE ACT

The Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, including all amendments ("TRIA" or the "Act"), establishes a program to spread the risk of catastrophic losses from certain acts of terrorism between insurers and the federal government. If an individual insurer's losses from "certified acts of terrorism" exceed a specified deductible amount, the government will reimburse the insurer for a percentage of losses (the "Federal Share") paid in excess of the deductible, but only if aggregate industry losses from such acts exceed the "Program Trigger". An insurer that has met its insurer deductible is not liable for any portion of losses in excess of \$100 billion per year. Similarly, the federal government is not liable for any losses covered by the Act that exceed this amount. If aggregate insured losses exceed \$100 billion, losses up to that amount may be pro-rated, as determined by the Secretary of the Treasury.

MANDATORY AVAILABILITY OF COVERAGE FOR "CERTIFIED ACTS OF TERRORISM"

Note: With respect to Excess or Umbrella policies, this offer of coverage pertains only to those lines of business covered by TRIA and, more specifically, does not apply to commercial automobile insurance.
