#### **Cardinal Connection**

Whew this year is flying by! April was extra busy for the Cardinal Connection. The College and Career Readiness Fair on April 16th included several opportunities for all high school students to speak with a variety of colleges and vocational schools along with Military personnel. Local employers looking for full and part time employees and interns, along with several applications available for summer jobs were available for students. On April 26th, Cardinal Connection (CC) partnered with UK Extension to bring Truth and Consequences to the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Students were given real life scenarios and had to go through various steps from hospital to counseling and sometimes jail. On the surveys, some reactions from students included "It showed me that we have a choice and every choice has a consequence" and "It shows you how dangerous all this really is." Reality store, also a partnership with UK Extension, allowed the 7th grade to go through a monthly budget based on a profession of their choice. They had to pay taxes, insurance, and several other monthly bills. It was definitely an eye opening experience for many students with statements like "I learned I need to save more money." On May 17, the Middle School will be having Mental Wellness Day touching on topics like anger, drugs, sugar, when to tell an adult, and coping methods.
