- 8 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 161.790(4) and KRS 161.770 requires
- 9 the commissioner of education to appoint an impartial three (3) member tribunal to conduct an
- administrative hearing and make the final determination on charges concerning a local school
- district's proposal to discipline or place on involuntary leave a teacher if the teacher gives timely
- 12 notice of his **or her** intent to answer the charges. This administrative regulation establishes
- administrative and hearing procedures with respect to the tribunal process and identifies the
- 14 required training for tribunal members designated to serve as tribunal members on an ongoing
- 15 basis.
- Section 1. Notification of Discipline or Involuntary Leave. A local school district
- superintendent proposing to discipline a teacher pursuant to KRS 161.790 other than private
- 18 <u>reprimand, or place a teacher on involuntary leave pursuant to KRS 161.770</u> [(except for a
- 19 private reprimand) or place on involuntary leave a teacher] shall immediately, after notice to the
- 20 employee, transmit a copy of the notice of the action to the commissioner of education, along
- 21 with advice as to the date of the receipt of the notice by the employee.

- 1 Section 2. Hearing Officer Qualifications. (1) Upon notification from a teacher pursuant to
- 2 KRS 161.790(3) of the teacher's intention to answer the charges against the teacher, the
- 3 commissioner shall appoint a hearing officer in accordance with KRS 161.790(4) who meets
- 4 the following qualifications:
- 5 (a) The hearing officer shall be an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth
- 6 of Kentucky and in good standing with the Kentucky Bar Association;
- 7 (b) The hearing officer shall complete biennial training as approved by the Kentucky
- 8 Department of Education related to the employment of teachers;
- 9 (c) The hearing officer shall complete biennial training as approved by the Kentucky
- 10 Department of Education related to the professional code of ethics for Kentucky school
- 11 <u>certified personnel set forth in 16 KAR 1:020; and</u>
- 12 (d) The hearing officer shall meet the training requirements set forth in 40 KAR 5:010.
- 13 [Continuances. (1)(a) If, after a requested hearing has been scheduled by the commissioner of
- 14 education or his designee, a continuance is requested by the teacher, the teacher shall specifically
- 15 and in writing waive the statutory hearing deadlines and any subsequent backpay award for the
- 16 period of the requested continuance. A continuance initiated by the teacher shall not be granted
- 17 without the appropriate waiver.
- 18 (b) If the continuance request was initiated by the school district, a waiver shall not be required.
- 19 (2) A continuance requested by the teacher may be granted for good cause shown, including
- 20 pending criminal charges making it inadvisable for the employee to testify at an administrative
- 21 hearing or late entry of an attorney into the case on behalf of the employee.
- 22 (3) A continuance requested by the school district, and not agreed to by the employee, may be
- 23 granted upon documentation of an emergency or other circumstance making it impossible or

- 1 prejudicially impractical for the district to adequately present its case at the scheduled hearing.
- 2 (4) A request for continuance made prior to the three (3) member tribunal convening shall be
- 3 submitted in writing to the hearing officer.]
- 4 Section 3. Teacher and Administrator Tribunal Member Qualifications. (1) Beginning in
- 5 2019 and every four years thereafter, the Kentucky Department of Education shall solicit
- 6 <u>applications to establish a pool of potential teacher or administrator tribunal members.</u>
- 7 <u>Individuals who wish to be considered for the pool of potential teacher or administrator</u>
- 8 tribunal members shall apply using the Teacher and Administrator Tribunal Member
- 9 Application. The Kentucky Department of Education shall select no more than twenty (20)
- 10 potential teacher tribunal members for the pool using procedures developed by the
- 11 <u>Kentucky Department of Education for the receipt, review, and selection of applicants.</u>
- 12 The Kentucky Department of Education shall select no more than twenty (20) potential
- administrator tribunal members for the pool using procedures developed by the Kentucky
- 14 Department of Education for the receipt, review, and selection of applicants.
- 15 (2) To be a member of the pool of potential teacher tribunal members designated to serve
- as a teacher tribunal member on an ongoing basis, a person shall:
- 17 (a) hold a valid teaching certificate issued by the Education Professional Standards Board
- 18 <u>and be in good standing; or</u>
- 19 (b) be retired and have held a teaching certificate issued by the Education Professional
- 20 Standards Board that was not revoked or surrendered as a result of revocation
- 21 **proceedings.**
- 22 (3) To be a member of the pool of potential administrator tribunal members designated to
- 23 serve as an administrator tribunal member on an ongoing basis, a person shall:

- 1 (a) hold a valid teaching certificate for the performance of administrative duties issued by
- 2 <u>the Education Professional Standards Board and be in good standing; or</u>
- 3 (b) be retired and have held a teaching certificate for the performance of administrative
- 4 duties issued by the Education Professional Standards Board that was not revoked or
- 5 surrendered as a result of revocation proceedings.
- 6 (4) Individuals selected for [To be a member of] the pool of potential teacher or
- 7 <u>administrator</u> tribunal members [who is] designated to serve as a <u>teacher or administrator</u>
- 8 tribunal member on an ongoing basis[, a person] shall complete[receive] training approved by
- 9 <u>the Kentucky Department of Education</u> on the following topics <u>at least once every four</u>
- 10 **years**:
- 11 (a) The hearing process;
- 12 (b) The role of the tribunal;
- 13 (c) The role of the hearing officer;
- 14 (d) How to determine facts;
- 15 (e) Fundamental fairness;
- (f) The law on teacher disciplinary actions set forth at [(|KRS 161.790[)];
- 17 (g) The professional code of ethics for Kentucky school certified personnel set forth in 16
- 18 **KAR 1:020**; and
- 19 (h)[g) The deliberative process.
- 20 [(2)] (5) For attending training approved by the Kentucky Department of Education required
- 21 to be [come] a member of the pool of potential **teacher or administrator** tribunal members, a
- person shall receive a per diem of \$100 and reimbursement of travel expenses from the
- 23 Department of Education.

- 1 Section 4. Expense Reimbursement. (1) The local school district shall pay all travel expenses of
- 2 the hearing officer tribunal member in accordance with 200 KAR 2:006.
- 3 (2) No later than the convening of the hearing, the local school district shall advise the <u>teacher</u>
- 4 <u>and administrator</u> tribunal members how to claim their per diem and travel expenses.
- 5 Section 5. Conduct of Hearing (1) A hearing before the tribunal shall be conducted in
- 6 accordance with KRS Chapter 13B.
- 7 (2) The tribunal shall be presented with the notification described in Section 1 which sets
- 8 forth the charges for discipline or involuntary leave.
- 9 (3) The hearing officer shall instruct the tribunal regarding the burden of proof, including
- 10 which party bears the burden of proof.
- 11 [Section 6. (1)] (4) If, for any reason and after testimony has commenced, a tribunal member
- becomes unavailable to complete the hearing of the evidence of both parties, an appropriate
- substitute tribunal member shall be appointed by the commissioner of education and provided by
- the school district with a written transcript of all prior proceedings at the hearing unless waived
- under subsection (5) [(2)] of this section.
- 16 (2) A hearing may be concluded and a decision rendered by a two (2) member tribunal upon
- express agreement of both parties so long as one of the two (2) tribunal members is a hearing
- 18 <u>officer member in accordance with Section 2 of this administrative regulation.</u>
- 19 <u>Section 6. Continuances. (1)(a) If, after a requested hearing has been scheduled by the</u>
- 20 commissioner of education or his designee, a continuance is requested by the teacher, the
- 21 teacher shall specifically and in writing waive the statutory hearing deadlines and any
- 22 subsequent backpay award for the period of the requested continuance. A continuance
- 23 initiated by the teacher shall not be granted without the appropriate waiver.

- 1 (b) If the continuance request was initiated by the school district, a waiver shall not be

- 3 (2) A continuance requested by the teacher may be granted for good cause shown,
